

WASTE MANAGEMENT KG SIRING BUKIT, MANTANANI - PROGRESS & UPDATE

May 2020



Background



Waste management system introduced by RCM in kg siring bukit in November 2018 as part of it's long term goal to improve resilience of the island's reefs.



Prior to the set up, RCM consulted and discussed with the household members to allow them to participate in designing the program.



The system which initially run as a trial are now adopted by the villagers in kg siring Bukit. Since then, waste generated such as food waste, plastic trash, and other general trash were able to be prevented from polluting marine ecosystem.

Process - system









Household are required to segregate their waste with the materials provided.

Two local part timers will go to each houses to collect the segregated waste.

Waste then transferred to waste segregation area where its get further sorted.

All waste excluding the food waste are then transported out either to recycling centre or dumping site in mainland – once it ready.

Progress



In average, 438kg of waste are collected from polluting marine ecosystem every month and more than 80% are food waste



Waste management in Kg Siring Bukit has been running since November 2018 – 18 month!




A total of 22 houses actively participating with more than 110 household members as direct beneficiaries



The design of this system has proven a successful outcome and now being replicated in Kg Padang involving 30 houses!

Monitoring and evaluation

A progress survey conducted every six month. Recent survey conducted May 2020, reveals that the locals agreed that the waste management system are useful in their daily life and easy to implement. Therefore, they will continue to participate and adopt the established system.
