# Qhobosheane Primary School

Qhobosheane is a primary school located in Diepkloof, a township in Greater Soweto, that was established in 1959 to accommodate those who were being forcibly removed from Alexandra. The school offers Grades R-7 and currently has 447 registered learners.

The surrounding community is characterised by high levels of poverty (the average income for the area is R0-R1500pm) and an unemployment rate 90%. The school is a non-fee paying school and receives an annual subsidy of approximately R 295 935.00.

Qhobosheane has a particularly high number of learners classified as Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVCs) and has a range of needs related to infrastructure development as well as social and skills development.



Since adopting  
Qhobosheane Primary School,  
Flight Centre Foundation has  
sponsored the renovation of the school's  
Grade R facility and the construction of  
a school feeding scheme kitchen.

Flight Centre Foundation has also hosted  
a number of volunteer days focusing on  
the betterment of the school's
