Most people in Africa live tough lives and face numerous challenges




- Goal: End poverty in all its forms everywhere
- Challenge: In Sub-Saharan Africa,
 ~43% of people are living below the poverty line^[2]



- Goal: "Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls"
- Challenge: With an average remaining gender gap of 32%, the Sub-Saharan Africa region scores in the lower middle range of the Global Gender Gap Index^[3]



- Goal: "Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all"
- Challenge: Less than 25% of Sub-Saharan Africans currently complete secondary education^[4]



- Goal: "Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all"
- Challenge: Although the Sub-Saharan region's per capita GDP growth will turn positive in 2018, it will remain insufficient to reduce poverty significantly^[2]

Turkana Region in a Nutshell

In the Turkana Region in Kenya 97% of people live in extreme poverty, suffering from unemployment caused by poor infrastructure, limited access to markets, and few formal job opportunities




- Kenya and especially the Turkana region face several challenges, underlining the need for social projects to improve education and fight poverty
- In the Turkana region, 97% of people live in extreme poverty, suffering from unemployment caused by poor infrastructure, limited access to markets, and few formal job opportunities
- Turkana has particularly infertile soil that does not support sustainable agriculture
- Local businesses (e.g., basket weaving, mechanical repairs, small kiosks) do not scale to provide widespread employment opportunities or meaningful wages
- With around 900,000 inhabitants, Turkana holds an untapped potential of human talent with the great advantage of having internet access even in some of the most remote areas



The Idea

The Learning Lions were founded to grant access to Internet and New Economy business models to provide ICT services in Africa for the global market



- Learning Lions' vision is to bring digital literacy and 21st century skills to the many high potential young adults of isolated and economically depressed regions of East Africa
- Earning an income from online work while remaining in their home region, they will build a path away from poverty and contribute to the development of their country

Business Model | Overview

The program starts at square one and educates, trains and supports young adults on their way as an ICT consultant or even entrepreneur



- Selects talented youth
- Provides basic and then targeted training in specific high value
 ICT & Media skills
- Prepares for client work within 9 months

- Offers performance-based stipends for students





Investment period


- Average duration: 12 months
- Total investment per successful graduate: 3,375€

Return period

- Duration until investment/education is paid back: 18 months
- Average monthly return per successful graduate: 150€

We have "lessons learned" from two classes of trained Lionesses into a three level concept to align Startup Lions closely with the realities and promises of young female talents in rural Africa:


- Comprehensive "building identity" program for competency in leading life in dignity
- Counseling by qualified senior female staff
- Team-building events & mixed study groups
- Set up day-care & live-in facilities to accommodate single mothers & young families
- Optimize layout for physical security
- Install a team culture that values diversity
- Specifically reach out to groups like young mothers facing hurdles to applying

What makes us different?

Compared to other initiatives the Learning Lions offer an integrated study and work program in remote and rural areas

COMPETITORS

- Based in urban areas
- Tap into existing (already prequalified) talent pools without addressing education bottlenecks
- For-profit models with no plan for empowerment of talents
- Basic data entry, data processing and relatively standardized (low human capital) Business Process Outsourcing tasks – limiting the earnings potential for locals
- Freelancing models: more precarious jobs, less opportunity to build reliable livelihood & family



LEARNING LIONS

- Focus on remote & rural areas
- Integrated study & work program working with talented high-school graduates without preconditions
- Focus on human-capital intensive and creative skills: higher value for local talents & personal growth
- Yearly review of training to match skills required in global market
- Clear path to entrepreneurship & ownership to foster work engagement and leadership skills
- Campus-model offers employment for less skilled community members: bigger multiplier effect
- Fully run on renewable energy

Achievements

Over the last years, the pilot was successfully completed and a solid organizational structure and network have been established



Successful completion of pilot (2016/2017):

- First student managed to exceed the mark of 1000\$ income in a month
- Last cohort solely taught by former students which became teachers themselves (peer to peer teaching approach)
- Establishment of **solid organizational structures** (decentralized management concept Holacracy) with an increasing number of tasks being taken over by our graduates



Winner of the Google Impact Challenge

Google Impact Challenge nominates the Digital Lions as the most innovative social enterprise using technology to improve society.




- Google impact challenge sought to identify and fund the most innovative social enterprises using technology to improve society
- 5000 participating organizations in Africa with around 1,300 in Kenia
- Google Team picked 30 projects for the semi-finals to invite them to a pitch in Nairobi and a full due diligence
- Digital Lions won the Judge's choice award at the final Event in Nairobi in November 2018
- The judges were impressed by the scalability of the project and by how fast it could show sustainable results with almost no overhead cost
- The price of the four final winners in Kenya is to receive a 250.000 USD Cash Grant and support and training from Google experts



Turkana Campus | The Concept

With the new Turkana Campus, the Lions plan to build an ICT center that includes accommodation, offices, and service facilities



EXCELLENCE IN RURAL AFRICA

- Startup Lions has been granted by the Turkana County government a property in Loropio at the shores of Lake Turkana to build an ICT center that includes accommodation, offices, service facilities (incl. health and nursery) and space for various rounds of expansion. This campus-like environment provides the best conditions to start successful careers, deliver high quality work, unleash personal creativity and live in dignity. We seek to provide a safe environment for talents with lives outside the rural mainstream (refugees, unmarried young women, LGBT, disabled).
- A high-quality internet connection via micro-wave will be ensured by the internet provider Safaricom, electricity and clean water will be produced by solar panels – just like already at our pilot location in the county capital Lodwar.

Turkana Campus | Development Steps

In a next step, Learning Lions plans to stepwise scale its operations and establish a campus and co-working space for more than 200 students, independently working Lions and consultants.






Business Case (1/2)

Business case assumes solid growth with in number of students and average income, leading to strong revenue growth.



Business Case (2/2)

Break-even will be reached in 2022



Income Assumptions

- Income generated by rent from Lions and the sold products
- Assumed revenue for rent of around 100€ per Lion per month is based on current cost for housing and food of the Lions
- Income from products sold is based on a revenue share of 30% that remain with the company, and 70% that are distributed to the Lions

Cost Assumptions Strongly influenced by depreciation on capex

- Only limited OPEX are assumed as volunteers work honorary and are less involved in operations
- Successful handover to Lions (e.g. more senior Lions are working as teacher) underlines sustainability and results in low costs

Growth Assumptions

- Strong growth of around 15% per quarter is assumed
- High growth rate is explained by currently small base figures
- Current revenues of more senior Lions show the potential of significantly higher average revenues per Lion

Turkana Campus | Impact by 2020

By 2020, we will have trained 390 young adults, created 135 jobs and lifted 350 people out of poverty.

TUNAPANDA INSTITUTE

Tunapanda Institute (TI) builds skills in digital technology, collaboration, problem solving, and creative self-expression. Their primary focus is on youth who lack the opportunity to continue their studies or whose learning styles do not favor rote memorization. TI runs a training center in Kibera, a large Nairobi slum serving hard-working individuals with 3-4 month intensive training programs. They form partnerships with local businesses and community groups to achieve maximal employment or advanced study for TI graduates. TI works with educational partners in rural and peri-urban parts of Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda to upgrade computer infrastructure, improve software offerings, and develop advanced technology, design, and communication skills. TI favors blended-learning, which empowers teachers and teaching facilitators with software and video content. TI helped to create the curriculum for Learning Lions and supported the education of the first cohorts easing the successful implementation of the peer to peer teaching program. www.tunapanda.org
