The John Langdon Down Foundation was created by Prof. Sylvia G. Escamilla, whose first child, "Eduardo", was born with this genetic disorder. With firm conviction she decided that through special education she would make her son a happy child. Sadly, Eduardo died at age five in a tragic accident.

The Foundation came to life in the spring of 1972, on April 3rd, as the first organization in the world of its kind dedicated to offering educational, medical and psychological programs to children, adolescents and adults with Down syndrome and also their lower income families.

MISSION

"To promote dignity, human rights and potential of people with Down syndrome, improving their quality of life".



Down syndrome is a genetic condition caused by the presence of a third chromosome in pair 21. It occurs in approximately one out of every 690 births and constitutes the most common cause of intellectual disability. There are 6 million people with Down syndrome in the world. Even though its origins are still unknown, we know that it has nothing to do with nationality, socio-economic background or religion. The risk of having a child with Down syndrome increases with the mother's age.

The Mexican School of Down Art is a visual arts academy where students from the John Langdon Down Foundation have a space that allows them to technically and symbolically express their ideas, emotions, perceptions and sensations through artistic creation. Education opens the doors to a complete world of great achievements, promoting the development of all human capabilities from which artistic ability is no exception.

The works of these extraordinary young people have been exhibited in museums and galleries with great success in more than 50 cities around the Americas, Asia and Europe. Their works have been recognized and acclaimed by notable visual arts masters both nationally and overseas.

Symbolic expression has permitted our young people to transform their lack of linguistic skills into shapes and colors through a variety of materials and visual arts techniques such as oil, charcoal, etchings, pyrographics, lithographs and sculpture. This is where artists recreate life under their own terms. Their language leads us through metaphor and hidden emotions to see life from another perspective. With their paintbrushes they manage to capture their feelings and emotions, their dreams, longings and frustrations, their desires and hopes.

OBJECTIVES

- Foster the development of abstract thought through artistic creation.
- Promote artistic expression and communication through visual arts.
- Encourage the complete participation and inclusion of people who have Down syndrome into society.

The *TRES 21 Arte-Café* chain is one of the programs run by the John Langdon Down Foundation, having as its main objective the promotion of social and employment inclusion for people with Down syndrome. The name has great significance as it refers to the presence of the three chromosomes in pair 21, which is characteristic of this genetic disorder.

At present we have four cafes open to the public. Following the norms for hygiene quality control, all food at the *TRES* **21 Arte-Café** is prepared with the help of students from the Culinary Art and Confectionary Workshop at the John Langdon Down Foundation.
