Introduction

The Ngao Foundation believes that every individual possesses inherent potential, talents, and capacities. With the right environment, these individuals can flourish, driving personal growth and community development. The Ngao Foundation Electrical Skill Training Program is a youth-focused initiative designed to equip young people with essential skills, enabling them to become self-reliant and support their families. This program aims to reduce youth apathy, idleness, crime, and drug abuse by providing purposeful engagement.

Program Overview

The Electrical Skill Training Program targets youth from slums and informal settlements in Nairobi, Kenya. Many of these youth have dropped out of school or never attended due to various challenges, including lack of schools and family vulnerabilities. The program seeks to teach minds touch hearts, and transform lives, offering a structured three-year training course with the following grade levels:

- Grade 3 (Entry Level): One year
- Grade 2: One year
- Grade 1: One year

Students must pass examinations at each level, supervised by the National Industrial Training Authority (NITA), a government body. Our practical-oriented training has resulted in high success rates, with all past students currently employed or engaged in self-employment.



Current Students

We currently have 12 full-time students across all grade levels:

- Grade 3: Rodgers, Joseph, Walter, and Daniel
- Grade 2: Barrington, Tobias, Collins, and Silas
- Grade 1: Damaris, Isaac, Coassam, and Peter

Training Material Requirements

For successful training, we need consumable and non-consumable materials for practical classwork. These include:

Consumable Materials

- T/E PVC sheathed cables: 1.5mm, 2.5mm, 4.0mm, 6.0mm, and 10.0mm
- Insulated wires (red, black, yellow): 1.5mm, 2.5mm, 4.0mm, 6.0mm, and 10.0mm
- PVC conduits (light and heavy gauge): 20mm, 25mm, 32mm

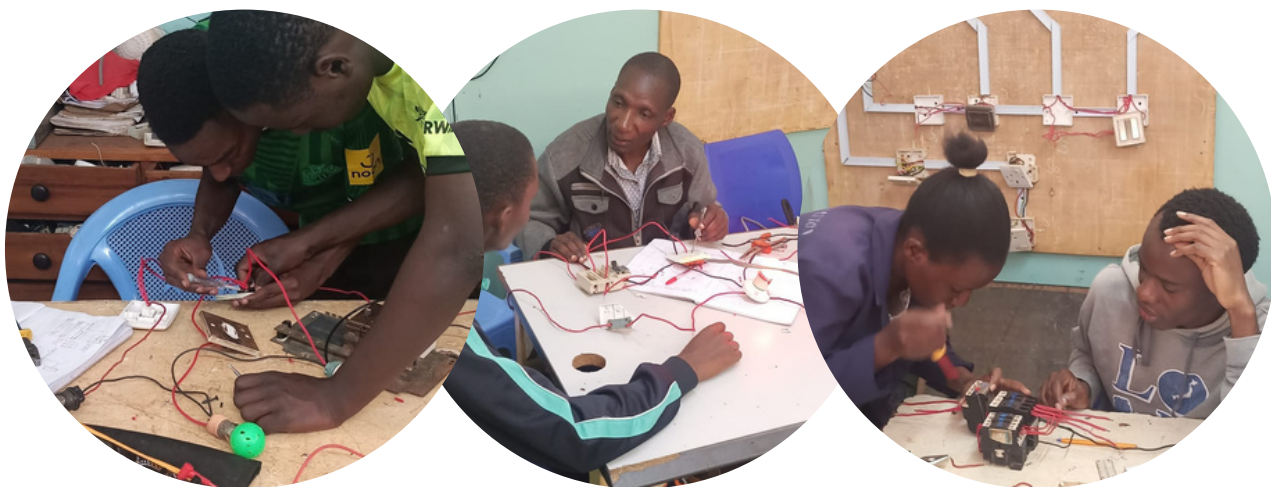

Examination Fees and Material Fees

- Grade 3: Examination fee \$50, Material fee \$25
- Grade 2: Examination fee \$60, Material fee \$27
- Grade 1: Examination fee \$75, Material fee \$34
