Central African Republic, the sixth most vulnerable country, has long-term political instability, poor regulated, and underdeveloped. The conflicts with neighbors and frequent civil wars, leads to the whole country suffers from violence and war.

Angela, 15 years old, and her best friend, Innes, grow up in the same village. When the rebels attacked their hometown in the middle of the night, they and their mothers escaped. They didn't bring anything except their clothes.

They can't remember how long it took to reach the camps for internally displaced people. Everything is very chaotic for the first few months. Angela and Innes try their best to adjust their lives, but the hardest part is they live without goals and hopes every day, just an endless waiting.

The girls are eager for change, the end of the war, and the opportunity to get an education. This lets them feel they are not wasting their lives. "Because I can't go to school and study, so I feel I don't have hope in the future," Angela said helplessly.





#### **Life Threaten**

In vulnerable countries, many children live in war and violence. They suffer from injury and life threats easily. They are forced to leave their hometown, even leave their family, and feel the shadow of death.





#### **Psychological Influence**

Children witness the violence of the war, and the fear when escape the hometown, this leads to children's insecurity. They are easy to feel nervous, scare, even have PTSD such as learning expression problems, and emotional disorders. This psychological shadow may influence their whole lives.







#### **Extreme Violence**

Displace children may become orphans, and expose to more extreme violence abuse. kidnapped, trafficked, and forced to become child soldiers. Besides, they are unable to attend school.





#### **Statistics Information**

- 1. **68.5 million** of people worldwide have been displaced, of which 25.4 million are overseas refugees, and **more than half** are children under 18 years old.
- 2. 57% of refugees come from Syria, Afghanistan, South Sudan.



#### **Statistics Information**

- 3. 85% of displaced people live in developing countries.
- 4. Every day, there are **44,400 people**, which is equivalent **every two seconds one person**, is forced to be displaced by conflict or persecution.

- In 2016, four places connection, created event milestones.


Until today, Taiwanese love, such as donations and participation in 30 Hour Famine Act, has accumulated more than **1 million** people to participate in related actions.

#### **Food Aid**

- Cooperate with WFP to provide rice.
- Provide food aid and supplies.
- Give nutritional supplement to children who is under 5 or severe malnutrition.
- Give nutritional supplement to women who is pregnant or breastfeeding.





#### **Education & Consultation**

- Help refugee children go back to school.
- Provide textbooks and school supplies.
- Provide consultation courses.
- Provide teacher training courses.
- Elevate school's management and quality.









#### **Children Protection**

- Construction protection network.
- Organize children's groups, advocate for basic rights.
- Encourage notification of violence and child marriage cases.





#### **Children Protection**

- Serve child victims, refer them to other resources.
- Raise awareness of child protection.
