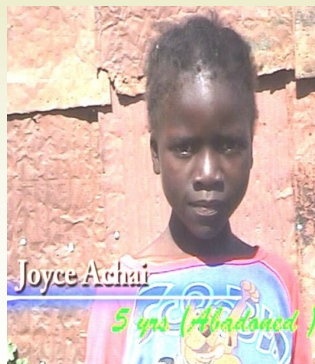

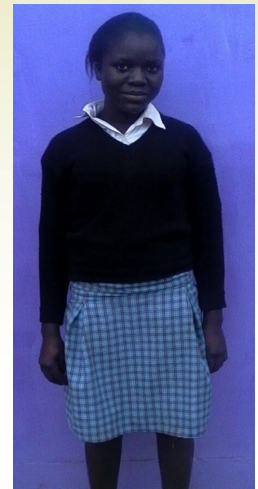

The Centre supports both orphans and vulnerable children by providing education where free lunch and educational material are given to all . Dandora has a total of 205 children (135 girls &

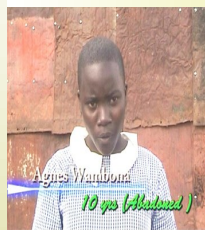
Mthare Mabatini Education Centre
