Backgroun d	BIRD is the acronym of Board for Integrated Rural Development , generally known as BIRD started its activities in November 28, 2007 with its own resource in the community of a small remote village Talbaria of Narail district. It is a non-political, non-profit and non-governmental organization (NGO) committed to participate and promote national development through upgrading the socio-economic condition of the disadvantaged/under-privileged poor communities of the society. Presently, the organization has expanded its activities to around 2 locations, both in rural and urban areas of the country with greater zeal and enthusiasm, through the assistance of a host of local and international development partners. The type, nature and size of the target group and stakeholders have also changed significantly over time.
