2. Project Description

2.1 Issue (Project Justification)

One estimate, by the Consortium of Street Children (CSC), an international charity, suggests the number of street children could be as high as between 250,000 and 300,000 throughout Kenya, including 60,000 in Nairobi alone.

Many of these children are sent by their parents to work or beg on the streets. Others are either orphaned or abandoned.

- There is no official figure on the number of homeless children in Kenya, a sign of the lack of interest by Kenyan authorities of the problem.
- An international charity suggests the number of street children could be as high as between 250,000 and 300,000 throughout Kenya, including 60,000 in Nairobi alone.
- Many leave their rural areas - where traditional community ties have loosened - for cities, where they have more chance of surviving by begging, finding odd jobs, scavenging rubbish sites, or prostitution.
- Girls face an especially tough time. They experience sexual abuse from residents and from other male street children. For that reason most of the girls in the street are infected with HIV/AIDS.
- Street children are always drawn to drug abuse and crime to survive the harsh conditions.

The other issues facing these children include harassment (sexual and otherwise), a general danger of violence, sexual exploitation, HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases, abuse, neglect, hunger, lack of shelter, pregnancy and lack of sanitary conditions.

Yet another problem facing street children in Kenya is the information surrounding them. Kenya Children of Hope states that the number of street children that are counted and reported differ from study to study. There is little consistency and it is hard to target a problem that is not fully understood.



There are many good people working to help and feed these children on a small scale, like a teacher described by BBC news. Other organizations such as SOS Children's Villages are doing good work and raising money to sponsor one child at a time.

While this work is necessary, the organizations working to help Kenyan street children need more funding. Rather than helping one child at a time, focus should be put on aiding all of the poor children in Kenya

2.2 Background

The Affable Family is a charity organization that was started on 6th August 2016. The group is registered with the Government of Kenya, with the office of the District Gender and Social Development Officer (DGSDO) as a community based organization. The organization registration number is **DAG/CBO/5/4/2017/203.**

The organization consist mainly of youths from **Christ Restoration Centre, Kawangware** in Nairobi Kenya. The church has been a support to the organization ever since it was started.

Other members of the organization are from different universities in Nairobi, Kenya who have a zeal to help the street children.

The organization has participated in the following charity activities:

- Visit children orphanages.
- Visit homes for the elderly.
- Cleaning programs of slums in Nairobi.
- Visit prisons to share love with prisoners.
- Visit hospital wards to share love with the sick.
- Participate in rescuing of abandoned small children from the street.

The affable family charity organization aims to build institutions called "Heavens" to provide basic necessities (food, clothing and shelter), education and rehabilitation of street children and mold them back to the society.

The heavens also targets to provide basic necessities to the widowed. The heavens will provide basic necessities for them as they help in taking care of the admitted street children.



2.3 Goals

- The Western Heaven project will accommodate five hundred street children from the street of major cities in Kenya to reduce the number of street children in the streets, providing basic necessities and education for them.
- The Western heaven project will rehabilitate two hundred street children who are addicted to drugs.
- The western heaven project will provide free education to two hundred neighboring children who are not able to afford education.

2.4 Objectives

- Five hundred street children that cannot afford education and basic necessities will receive them for free.
- Two hundred street children addicted to drugs will be counselled and given proper care to help them overcome their addiction.
- Two hundred children neighboring the western heaven project and aren't able to afford education will acquire education from the project.

2.5 Outcomes

- On short term our objectives are to provide accommodation, rehabilitation and basic necessities for the target group.
- On long term our objective is to provide quality education for the target groups.

- Provide basic necessities

The western heaven will also sustain itself from fees of neighboring children who are willing to join the western heaven school. The fee will be cheap and fair to be affordable to residents around the facility.

2.13 Communication

The outputs and the outcomes of the project will be disseminated to the target group through flyers, interviews and also the project will be open to the target group for them to come and evaluate the outcomes.



2.14 Equal opportunities and equity

The project will ensure equal opportunities to each gender in the following way:

The western heaven will accommodate five hundred (500) street children, where two hundred and fifty (250) will be male gender and two hundred and fifty (250) will be of the female gender.
