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The Problem

According to UNESCO Institute of Statistics, 60% of of youths aged 15-17 are not in school and one of the factors responsible for this is wealth. In general, 15-17 year olds are four times as likely to be out of school as children aged 6-12.

This is partly because Junior Secondary School completion is free while senior secondary school is not. Also, these young people are often of legal working age.

The Approach

To reduce the number youths who are out of school as a result of poverty in Nigeria, OpenFees designed Project Senior Secondary School Completion (Project 3S). The project uses approaches that can meet the immediate and future needs of the youths. Approaches such as direct fee funding, behaviour change communications and policy influence are used to ensure access, quality, completion and sustainability of basic education for poor youths in Nigeria.

The Results


As a result of these intervention over 90 students who may have dropped out of senior secondary school as a result of their inability to pay fees are now preparing to complete their senior secondary school examination and earn the basic education required to become active and productive citizens.
