



PROPOSAL FOR FUNDING DYSLEXIC CHILDREN IN 20 COMMUNITIES

Emechihu Favour Discovery Foundation (EFDIF) plans to empower vulnerable dyslexic children in 20 Communities in Abuja to reduce physical abuse by parents, guardians and teachers due to the child's learning disabilities.

Emechihu Favour Discovery Foundation (EFDIF) seeks \$89 to provide 40 dyslexic screening tool kits to enable us cover our operational expenses and also settle the trainees who will care for the special need children.

Abuja has over 50 communities with 1.1 million of the population as children between 0-15 years. The recent survey has shown that 20% of these Communities have dyslexic children especially the vulnerable children such as the poor, disabled, orphans, abused and the girl child with learning disorder who attended schools but never finished due to lack of care. Instead of allowing them to be tortured by teachers, guardians and parents EFDIF will provide 40 dyslexia screening kits to assess them and provide support for their inabilities and an opportunity to become part of solution for their community.

Our goal is to intervene/empower the most vulnerable dyslexic children between the ages of 3-15, in 3 years (from 2019 – 2022) through visitation to schools and communities in rural areas.

The specific objectives are:

Objective 1: Within the first 6 Months of project implementation 40 Dyslexia screening Kits will be provided for all the 20 Communities in Abuja Municipal Area Council; each community will have 2 each. Volunteers will raise awareness of dyslexia to parents, guardians and teachers in communities by training them on how to care for the dyslexic children.

Objective 2: In the 2nd half of the year Board members/volunteers will be assigned to each community to identify, screen and assess children with dyslexia.





Objective 3: In the 2nd Year, Board members, staff and volunteers will develop children’s learning abilities by engaging them in training and provide learning resources to teach them in a way they will understand and perform very well academically and excel in life without being tortured.

In the 3rd Year the number of dyslexic children would have decreased after assessment and treatment. And also 1,000 well-trained special Need Teachers to care for them. Over 100,000 parents/teachers will be aware of dyslexia and how to provide necessary care and support for them in the society.

BUDGET

The organization hopes to find benefactors to move the project forward. The cost summary below is based on our approach outlined above. They are structured in line with the different stages that we would go through from start to implementation.
