TOKA recently helped create an inspiring study about the Service Learning Network, a growing group of educators and youth leaders working together to make learning more meaningful through real-life experiences.



# Protecting Water, Building Awareness

Training Teachers and Engaging Students in Sustainable Water Practices



This initiative aims to raise awareness among young people about the critical importance of Kosovo's water resources and how they can play an active role in protecting them.

As part of the project, **9 educators took part in interactive training sessions** where they explored creative ways to teach students about water pollution and sustainable water use. Through educational games and group discussions, they learned how to make these topics engaging and relevant in the classroom.

The training provided practical tools and knowledge that empower teachers to inspire their students to take meaningful action.

By equipping both educators and youth with the skills to protect Kosovo's water resources, this initiative is helping to build a generation of environmentally conscious and proactive citizens.

# Train of Trainers in Experiential Learning Methodology

Training professors and Mentor-Teachers in ELM Methodology



In partnership with Faculty of Education, TOKA held the second "Train of Trainers" **with 11 professors and mentor-teachers present for co-designing the "Experiential Learning" methodology.** This training aims to enhance teaching methods by focusing on hands-on, real-world learning experiences.

Excitingly, the program will now be offered not only for primary and secondary education but also for pre-primary education and vocational education. This expansion ensures that more educators and students will benefit from the program's innovative approach.

The program has been further enriched thanks to the valuable contributions of professors from the Faculty of Education, the TOKA staff, and mentor teachers. They shared their expertise and insights, helping to shape a more comprehensive and effective training experience.

With the combined efforts of all involved, we're confident that the "Experiential Learning Methodology" will make a lasting impact on educators and students across various education levels.

# Myopia Awareness Through Action

Engaging Super Volunteers to Protect Eyesight in Local Communities



The goal of the activity was to raise awareness among students about myopia and the importance of protecting their eyesight. This project, carried out by Super Volunteers, had a significant impact, with **more than 120 volunteers actively engaging in the activities and education.**

Through educational activities and information sharing, more than **3,000 people benefited** from the project, learning how to take care of their eyesight and take steps to prevent vision problems like myopia. This large-scale involvement contributed to increasing awareness at the local level.
