



Marhaba a 14-years-old school student lives with her seven family members in Kabul city. She was normally attending school classes and had no clue of a Hugh intra-abdominal mass in her belly. After a while slowly she noticed symptoms such as abdominal mass, discomfort, pain and swelling in her belly and she started fainting during her classes at school. Her parents became worried and despite visiting several doctors and healthcare providers in Kabul city, her problem became more serious.

Ultimately, her parents were despair and decided to take her abroad undertaking bulk of expenses for treatment in neighboring countries. But the miracle was to happen again at FMIC; after contemplation of so many medical examinations through Kabul well-known physicians and consulting with CEO of FMIC, she was referred to the French Medical Institute for Mothers and Children for surgery.

The FMIC Paediatric surgery team led by Dr. Mohammad Tareq Rahimi, Head of Paediatric Surgery Department successfully operated her on May 22, 2019. A mass of five KGs was removed. The mass was cystic, (28*22*24cm in size) originated from her right ovary, possibility of ovarian Hugh cyst or maybe ovarian Teratoma, sent to FMIC Pathology department for histopathology examination.

An abdominal mass is an abnormal growth in the abdomen. An abdominal mass causes visible swelling and pressure to other organs and may change the shape of the abdomen. A person with an abdominal mass may notice weight gain and symptoms such as abdominal discomfort, pain, psychological stress and bloating.

The unique operation as a miracle happened in FMIC. Marhaba discharged soon after the next day of operation, healthy and feeling well to resume back her school classes. Marhaba's father, Sayed Nasratullah, who is the only breadwinner in the family, says: "I am very happy and grateful about my daughter's successful operation performed at FMIC which preventing us from going abroad; accompanying with three family members and a fixer,
