The Directors' Visit



Grade one enrollment

The enrollment of grade one commences every year in November to secure a place at our school for the forthcoming year. Unlike other schools, we screen families whose child is being considered for enrollment at our school coupled with home visitation to ascertain the vulnerability of the child, the living conditions and how many children go to school in that household. This is to ensure a place is given to a deserving marginalized child who otherwise would never have the opportunity to be schooled.



Solar Lanterns

Immense Load shedding has struck Zambia and no one knows when it will come to an end following 2023/2024 drought which was declared a national disaster by the president. People are living for more than 48hrs without electricity and if power comes only last for not more than 2 hours. And this has affected citizens economically and socially.

In the midst of this horrible load shedding, Mr. Scott Johnson founder/CEO of Sufishent, Kentoon Rotary and Marni Silverberg the organizer of this donation from Evergreen Community Charter School, Asheville, North Carolina donated 33 solar lamps to The Other Side Foundation School.
