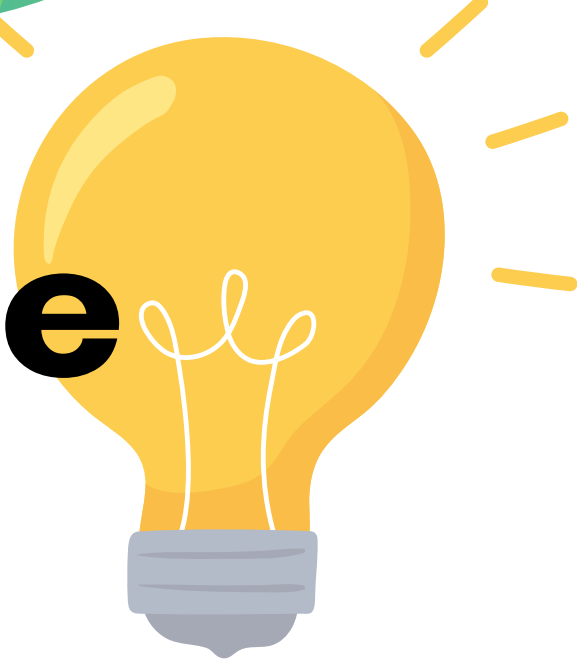
Prepping school for success

For over a year, our school faced the daunting challenge of operating without running water, a situation that tested our resilience and determination. Yet, in the face of adversity, hope shines brightly. Thanks to the unwavering support of our sponsors, we are now in the process of installing a new, larger water tank and pump. This vital upgrade will not only ensure a reliable water supply but also enable us to provide uninterrupted classes and nourishing meals for our students. Together, we are building a future where every child can learn and thrive without the worry of water shortages.



Education needs partners

On January and February we worked on enrollment processes to have students from kindergarten to ninth grade. Since we are a legally a Non-Profit, we search for partners to provide our children with their legal certifications and books align with the honduran national curriculum for education, plus evaluation of our educational processes, teachers performance and overall work. We partner with a local and close government school Eusebio Fiallos for our preschool and elementary students, IHER for our high-school students and ALFASIC for teenage students who are enrolled in elementary. We also finally gave Angelica Cuellar her ninth grade diploma, officially finishing Basic Education.

We partner with government school Eusebio Fiallos to provide certifications to Preschool and Elementary.



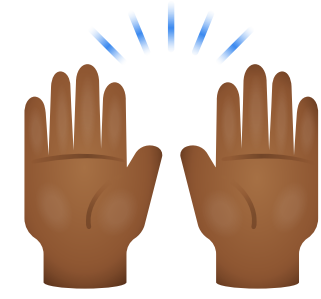
Enrollment process

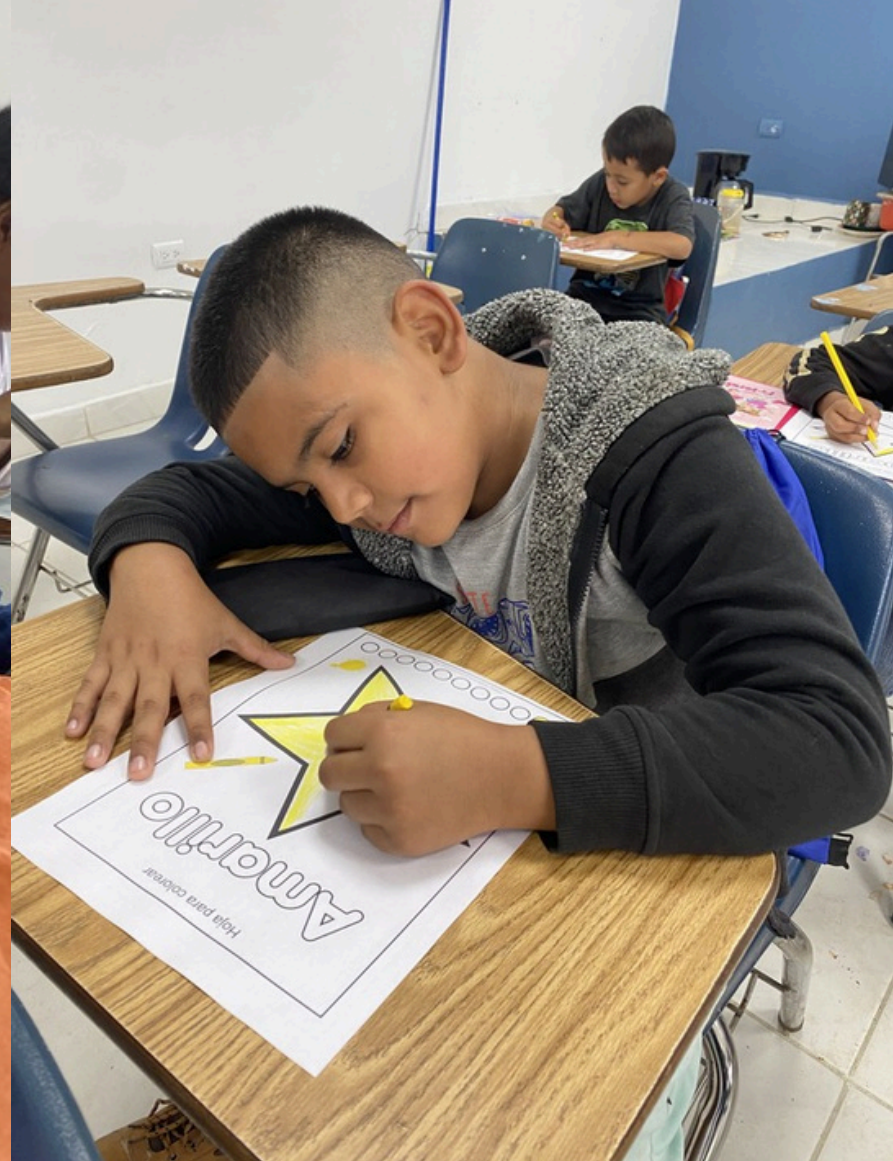
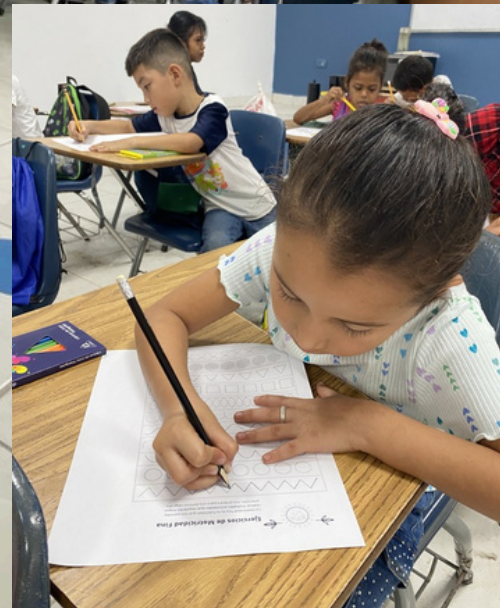
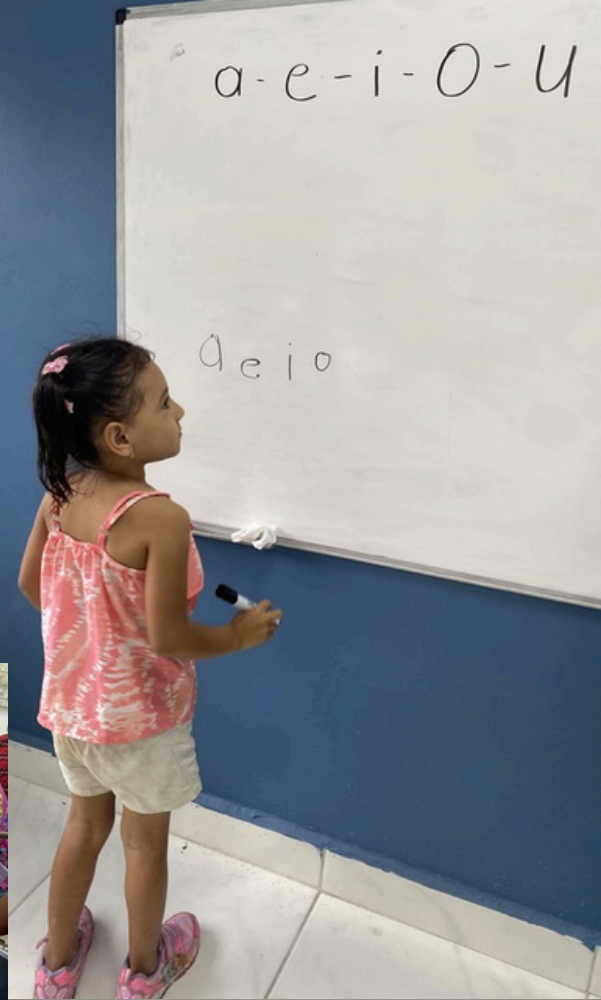
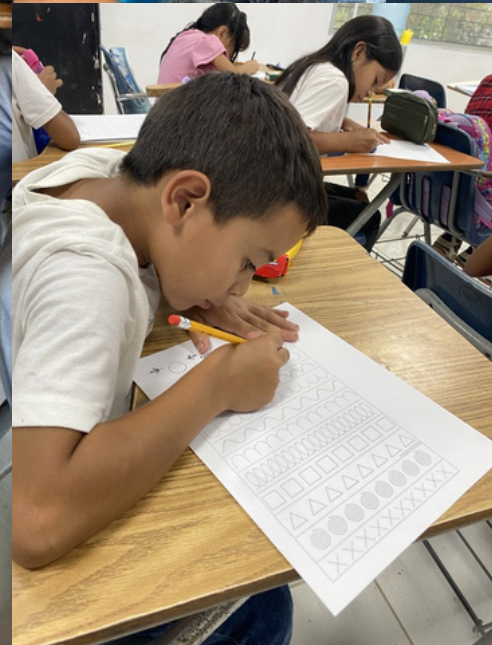


Opening our school year praising God
