Many families have been affected and there is much panic mostly in vulnerable households. In Mwererwe community, we grow food which parents share for consumption and sale the surplus to supplement the ongoing farm activities. However, in Gangu Community, there is no land for growing food, therefore the food grown in Mwererwe also supports our beneficiaries of Ggangu.
