Girl Talk Program

Girls face numerous challenges in their daily lives, which can negatively impact their academic performance. Studies show that many girls do not discuss their issues with their mothers or friends. To address this, Go for Girls created a platform called "Girl Talk," where girls can openly discuss their problems and ask questions. This program has had a significant positive impact.





We also hosted visitors from the local police unit, who educated the students on their rights and the importance of education.



Achievements

- Lack of Funds: Limited funding restricts our ability to visit more schools, especially outside the central region.
- **Sewing Equipment:** The newly introduced sewing clubs require sewing machines and materials to function effectively.
- Regular Monitoring: Lack of funds for transportation makes it difficult to regularly monitor the progress of our projects.
- **Inadequate Washrooms:** None of the schools we work with have proper washrooms, posing a significant challenge for the girls.

Future Plans

- **Expansion:** Extend the project to other regions in the country.
- **Counseling Programs:** Introduce counseling programs in areas such as mental health, relationships, and HIV/AIDS.

Immediate Assistance

This quarter, we continued to assist girls from Kaps Secondary School with sanitary pads to ensure they stay in school during their menstrual periods. This initiative has contributed to lower absenteeism among girls. We aim to provide sanitary pads to all the schools we work with, contingent on the availability of sufficient funds.

Planned Activities

- **Teach Fundamental Sewing Skills:** Continue teaching girls essential sewing skills.
- Conduct Girl Talk Sessions: Hold Girl Talk sessions in all the schools we work with.
