CURRENT OPPORTUNITIES:

The Details

- **100% Renewable Energy & 30% Energy Efficiency Law:** Puerto Rico just created the quickest shift away from fossil fuels and to renewables & efficiency ever. Transitioning from 3% renewable energy today to 40% within 5 years is almost inconceivable, and ramping up energy efficiency to lower electric usage by 2% each year. Getting there will require everyone who's able, to respond.
- **Federal Support:** There's over \$100 billion headed to Puerto Rico to help mitigate the losses from future hurricanes. Lack of power was the #1 reason why over 3,000 people died in the fall of 2017 after Hurricanes Irma & Maria. Federal funds (FEMA, HUD, DOE, USDA, and others) should be prioritized to prevent loss of life from lack of power.
- **Utility Business Model Change:** PREPA has defaulted on over \$12 billion in debt, and a federal court has ordered PREPA to liquidate all assets, including selling all generation and privatizing Transmission & Distribution. How this process unfolds should be directed by what most effectively accelerates efficiency and renewable energy deployment.
- **Integrated Resource Planning:** There's never been an IRP (20-year plan for electric investments) in Puerto Rico. The current attempt to create one should provide an accurate roadmap for efficiency & renewables deployment.
- **Rulemakings:** The Energy Bureau (PREPA's regulator) is creating a multitude of rules right now to implement clean energy laws: Wheeling, Microgrids, Renewable Energy Credits (RECs), Valuation of use of PREPA assets, Consumer Choice, a Systems Operator, Energy Cooperatives, Solar Renewable Energy Credits (SRECs). They all need strong organized advocacy to end up well written, to work well with each other, to withstand judicial review and to be well implemented.
- **New Financing:** More financing will become available as we cultivate credit-worthy off-takers.
- **Potential Studies:** Studies on clean energy potential need to be accurate, and aimed at increasing the rate of deployment of renewables and efficiency.
- **Supportive Politicians:** There's widespread support for Puerto Rico's swift energy transition right now. There might not always be, so we have to work fast.
- **Competitive Pricing:** Renewables and efficiency are the cheapest options today. Our interests in the success of efficiency and renewables are directly in line with consumers' interests in lowest-possible electric rates.
- **Strong Awareness & Demand:** Hurricanes Irma & Maria have shocked a generation into awareness of the vulnerability and high cost of imported fossil fuel dependence. Everyone wants clean renewable efficient energy. Let's provide it.


