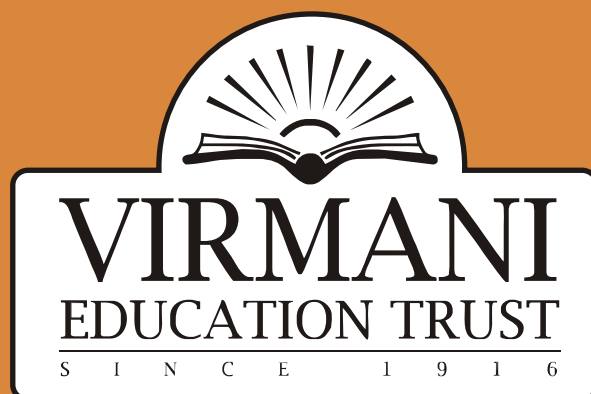

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## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



We'd like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to you for your continued support to our efforts in improving the lives of the disadvantaged section of society.

For the past 100 years, the Dhanpatmal Virmani Education Trust and Management society has strived to provide a quality education through our following initiatives.

The **Dhanpatmal Virmani Senior Secondary school** provides free education to 750 students,

The **Virmani Public School and Nursery** provides education at very nominal rates to 450 students.

The **Ram Narain Virmani Scholarship endowment** fund and other scholarships funded by the Virmani family members to provide merit cum means scholarships to students for both school and college studies.

**Women Literacy and Empowerment program** teaching Hindi and Arithmetic to 40,000 women annually.

We look forward to a long lasting relationship and support from you to enable us to fulfill our mission of uplifting the lives of the disadvantaged and help them in achieving their dreams.

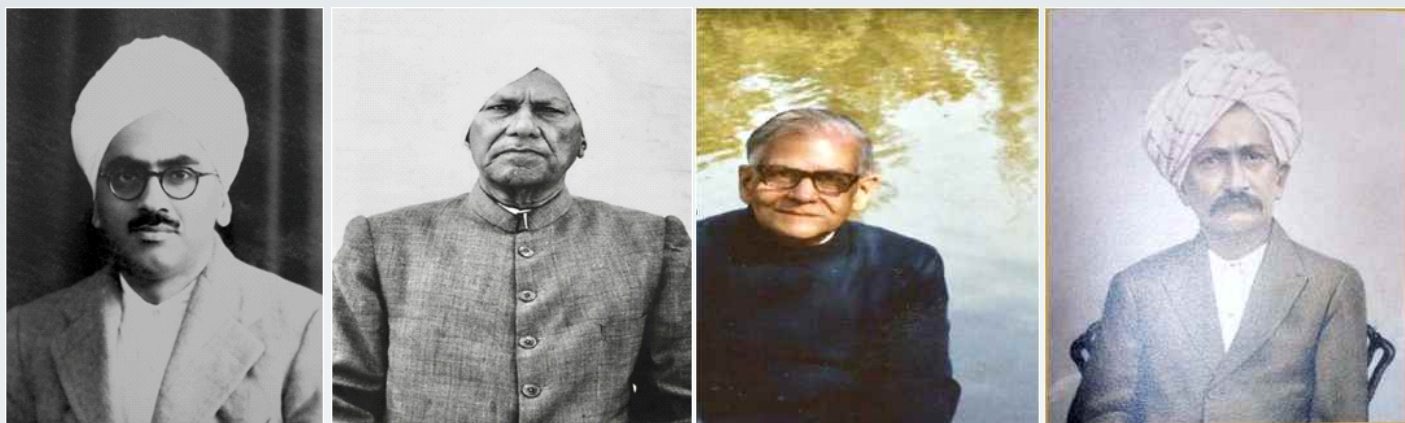

## **CHERISHED HISTORY OF THE ORGANIZATION:**

### **WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO**



One hundred years ago, two brothers decided to open a charitable school in the name of their father Dhanpatmal Virmani in Lyallpur.

It was 1916. India was under British rule and nationalist feelings were strong. Cities were springing up in the sleepy countryside led by the British to boost their economy. The reformist Arya Samaj was modernizing old ways of belief. A nascent industrialization was changing the face of a feudal class and society.

Building upon their experience of the family business in the wholesale grain trade, the two young brothers, Diwan Chand and Jwala Das built and ran a successful empire of agri-business in west Punjab and beyond. Between them, they had flour mills, sugar mills, cotton ginning factories and oilseed extraction plants.

Their families grew exponentially and so did their prosperity in Lyallpur city, now fast transforming into a hub of industry and manufacturing. Their quick rise in that early industrial age and their own father's philanthropic tradition motivated the brothers to set up a school across 17 acres that followed the Arya Samaj tradition that they strongly supported and a separate girls' orphanage and school in the heart of city.

The Virmani family as one of Lyallpur's earliest settlers had sprawling homes with modern amenities and lived well. Both the brothers had married into the same family- Manektalas. Diwan Chand's wife Rambai was illiterate but she made modern education a priority for her children, both boys and girls almost all of whom went on to become graduates. Dr. Hansraj Virmani was the first in the business family to earn a medical degree from the prestigious King Edwards Medical College and Satyapal Virmani became the youngest person at 23 years, to be on the Board of the Reserve Bank of India.

Partition changed all equations in 1947. Lands, factories, mills, homes, wealth and capital was abandoned as the families fled and started new lives in scattered directions. The Jwala Das family revived their industrial endeavors in different locations, while the Diwan Chand family moved away from industry after their sole sugar mill in India was acquired by the government and went into diverse activities. Yet they all eventually recovered from the losses and went on to lead successful lives while making strenuous efforts to ensure that the school was restarted in India.

Today, the elders of that generation have all gone but the joint commitment to the school, its charitable activities and the work of the Trust continues to keep the different branches of the extended family together. The celebration of the Centenary of the pact of the two brothers to honor their father and keep their legacy intact for coming generations; is a testimonial to that commitment. It is seen in the expansive efforts in the school and through its dynamic Women's Literacy Programme.

The Trust has remained true to its charitable core and efforts to use wealth to give back to society.

# ADULT LITERACY

## **WOMEN LITERACY AND EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM**



**Women Literacy & Empowerment Program (WLEP)** is a program of Virmani Trust zealously working to provide functional literacy to underprivileged illiterate adult women. We started off with this beautiful journey in 2004 with only 2 centers at Majnu Ka Tila teaching 60 beneficiaries. There were hindrances and ups & downs and at one point we even thought of giving up. The dedication and enthusiasm of our President, C.E.O and our Women Literacy Team did not let us fall and also the mission of the forefathers of Virmani Trust “Giving back to society” kept us motivated and unstoppable.

We feel really proud to share with you that today we have 646 centers in Delhi, Haridwar, Uttarakhand and Haryana teaching 38,760 beneficiaries. During the last 13 years, 2,00,000 women, their families and community have benefited from our programme. Beneficiaries are taught to read and write Hindi and Arithmetic.



## **ABHA- EMPOWERING WOMEN FOR A BETTER TOMORROW**

The project runs in collaboration with Tata Power Delhi Distribution Limited where 673 women, known as ABHA, residing in North Delhi slums create awareness regarding safety issues from electric wires. They reach out to people by visiting them door to door. Also different initiatives of Tata Power-DDL such as Drug De-Addiction Camps, Mobile Dispensaries, Cash Vans and LED distribution, make people aware about their benefits. The initiative helps these women to earn money, promotes personality development, public speaking and most importantly respect in the society. Earn While Learn (EWL) is a program where women make the defaulter residents pay their old electric outstanding dues and install regular meters in place of illegal connections are also paid honorarium.

## MEDICAL CAMPS

We are very much aware of the fact that private hospitals charge exorbitant fees for various basic tests and medications. The major reason behind the medical health camps is to provide the destitute community with free tests and low cost medication. Therefore, consumers do not have to travel to distant places for minor checkups. The basic tests conducted by the medical health camps are Blood Pressure (BP), Cold and Flu, Iron deficiency, Calcium, Fever, Body weight etc.

With continuous hard work and determination, I learnt how to read and write Hindi & Arithmetic efficiently. Also, I performed well in my exams. Presently, I am working as the Center in- Charge at a Women Literacy Center, and teach other women to read and write. My dream that once seemed unachievable is fulfilled today just because of my diligent attitude.

Whatever you do in life, all that matters is taking small steps towards your goal. Rest of the things will eventually fall into place.

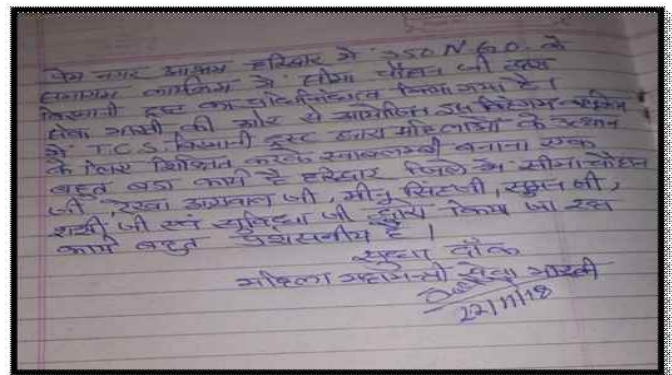
#### 4. SEVA SANGAM EVENT

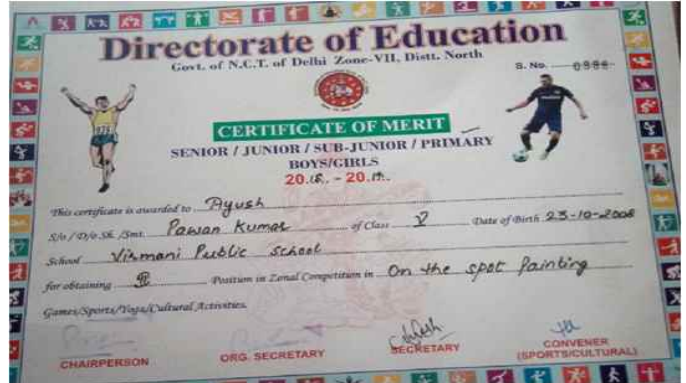


## ACHIEVEMENTS

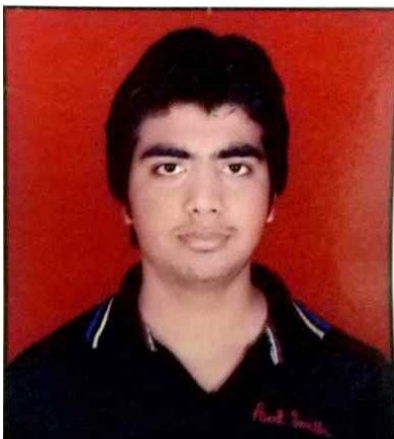

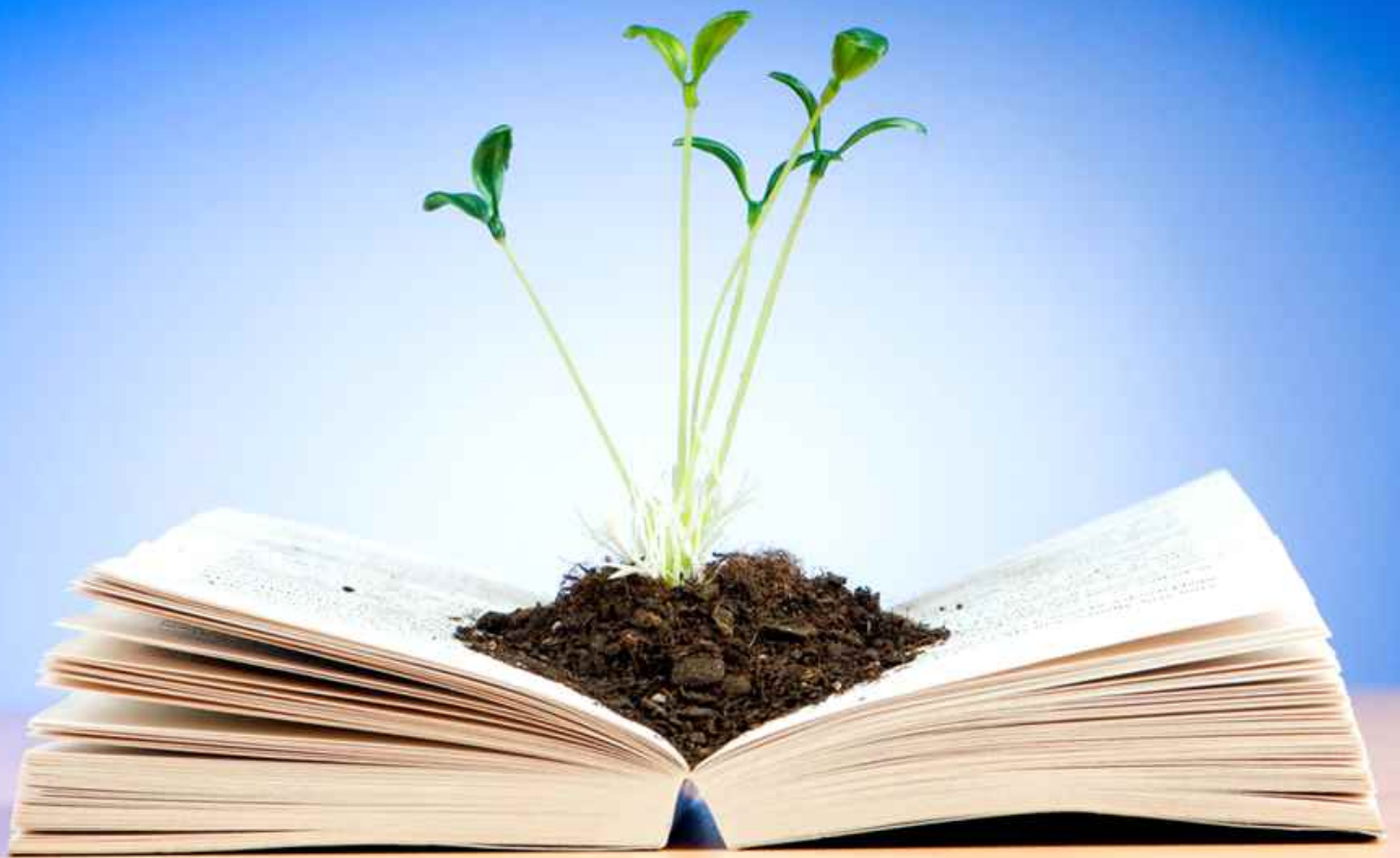


## **WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR**
