### **IBB ZOO RESCUE**

The Yemen blockade has prevented OWAP-AR from evacuating these endangered World Heritage species to safe asylum at DECAN Wildlife Sanctuary in Djibouti for the duration of the War, so OWAP-AR is endeavouring to keep them alive on-site where they stand and upgrade their living conditions..Taiz Zoo houses 387 range animals, including 31 Arabian Leopards; the world-famous critically endangered *Panthera pardus nimr* . Ibb Zoo has 58 animals including 10 Lions ....Both places are obsolete, cruel, bankrupt and struggling to survive..

### **ARABIAN HORSE RESCUES**

**The Arabian Horse originated in Yemen. Kim Michelle 's rescues include Yemen's entire fleet of Arabian Police Horses, abandoned to starve to death in the capital city of Sana'a; supporting stable-hands and vets in the process...as well as bringing starving Dhamar Q'rab Farm, Soyoun Riding Club and Al Bayda Stables' Arabian Horses back from the brink ongoingly...**

### **FARM ANIMAL RESCUES**

OWAP-AR Charity also provides fodder to Rosabah Farm imported French Dairy Cows in Dhamar Yemen and fodder, grains & vet treatment for the hungry Cows, Bulls, heifers, Sheep, Chickens, Geese, Ducks and Pigeons at the Colleges of Agriculture of Sana'a University & Ibb University...



*Arabian Leopard*  
(Panthera pardus nimr)

Considered rare and close to extinction, Taiz Zoo's remaining 26 Arabian Leopards and 2 cubs comprise about a quarter of the entire captive breeding program of these critically endangered Leopards, which is 15% of the entire species worldwide, both wild and captive.

The fate of these starving leopards can directly and severely affect the fate of the entire subspecies of Arabian leopards. They are currently listed on Cites Appendix 1.

Due to the hardship of Taiz Zoo's inhumane confinement and year-long food deprivation, it has been a recurrent tragedy for many months that the mothers kill their new-born offspring, further complicating the problem. Please consider donating for their long-term care to:
