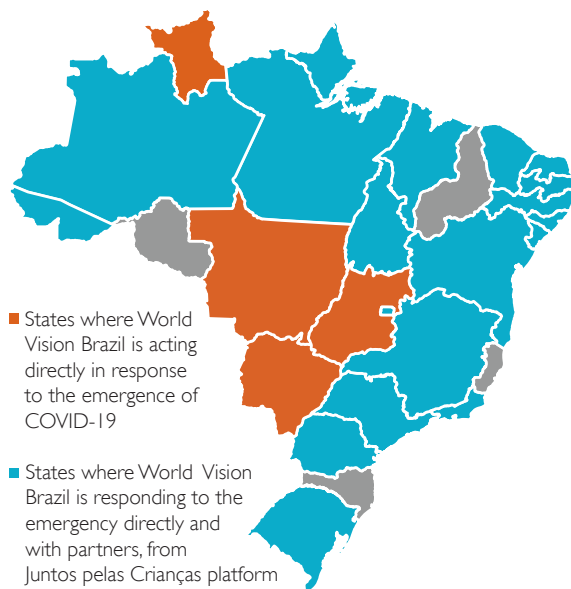




Situation Report | January 4, 2021



Situation Overview

- Currently, Brazil is experiencing a second wave of contamination with the gradual increase of COVID-19 in all regions, with the Southeast and Northeast being the most affected.
- With the arrival of the year-end festivities, governments have applied new lockdown measures and intensified inspections in an attempt to avoid agglomerations and contain the increase in contagions caused by the New Coronavirus.
- More than 40 countries in the world have already started the optional vaccination of the population, however, the Ministry of Health of the Federal Government has not yet officially released a national immunization plan as part of the fight against the pandemic.

Response Activities

- World Vision has maintained the regular supply of inputs for hygiene and cleaning items, investing heavily in promoting healthy habits for riverside and indigenous families affected by the pandemic in Amazonas, through the implementation of projects such as BHA / OFDA.
- The "Super Boxes" operation was launched as a new version of the "Tenderness Boxes". In the actions, the children received a toy, a recipe with ingredients to prepare with the family, as well as other resources to promote interactive activities that contribute to the strengthening of dialogues between parents and children.
- A major fire in the main Macapá (AP) power substation affected 90% of the population that had basic services discontinued. World Vision integrated efforts with the Evangelical Mission of Assistance to Fishermen (MEAP) and brought basic food baskets and drinking water to 265 families, reaching 833 children in the operation.

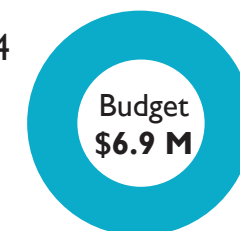
