## SPOTLIGHT ON Opportunity Tanzania

Tanzania is one of the poorest countries in the world. Approximately 90% of Tanzanians live on less than \$2 per day and 60% live on less than \$1 per day. However, Tanzania is also a place thriving with potential. One out of every three Tanzanians is self-employed, indicating a high level of microenterprise activity. Yet only 20% of the population has access to a formal bank within an hour's walking distance of their home. Recognizing this great need, Opportunity is building a bank for people living in poverty. In order to make this vision a reality, Opportunity will need to raise \$2.4 million in 2010. Current initiatives include:

- application for banking license to enable Opportunity to offer interest-bearing savings accounts with a low minimum deposit balance
- expansion of Opportunity's "hub and spoke" model to reach underserved people in rural areas, with roll out of four new branches in 2010
- provision of transformational training to all clients
- introduction of a health insurance product that will cover Tanzania's most common illnesses
- hiring of approximately 70 new staff in 2010
- collaboration with the Young Ambassadors for Opportunity and the Tanzania Country Champion Team to educate and inspire new financial partners
