Her parents have commented on how her spoken English has greatly improved, evidenced by the fact she speaks it more often than she has before.

Edna earned 7 distinctions in her 3rd Term examinations and also placed first in the overall academic class standing. Her success can most likely be attributed to her love for school. When she is home she says she misses the school environment. She loves the teaching at her new school and is serious about her opportunity of earning a quality education.

At the 2008 awards ceremony held at Leopards Hill Secondary School, Edna Lungu received awards for the 1st position in Geography, Religious Education, Information Technology, Office Practice and Civics. She received awards for 2nd position in Mathematics and Science.

He worked for six months and then was able to raise enough funds to return a finish school. He then found sponsorship to attend college, attaining a degree in accounts. Her grandfather faced even more tragedy in his adult life — losing four of his children to illness. Nevertheless, he persevered and provided for his wife and five other children. Edna related how he would come home from work, always with books in hand. He would sit for hours helping Edna to read—because of her grandfather's help, Edna was able to read even

I am enjoying the subjects at this school especially science and mathematics. I wouldn't even want to miss them. Ever since I started school here I have never missed a single subject or period.

I am also enjoying the activities that we do and the different trips that we go on. I hope I can do well to please you.

I have learnt to have a giving hand even to those I don't know and just to everyone. I have learnt to have hope in whatever I do and to appreciate what I have and what others do for me and my relatives. I have learnt to have a broad mind and to have the sense and virtue of help in me. I have come to realize that you can get help and courage from anyone even if people don't know you. And KF has really helped me a lot in the sense that it has taken a burden from my parents. Instead of struggling with four children, they now only struggle with three and that is a very big difference that KF has brought to my family and me. I now feel the impact of the help I get from KF because I see how my parents struggle to get money and feed us or send my siblings to school.

The trips we take as KF students have change me in different ways. I have come to appreciate what I have on my plate and not what I cannot get. My favourite events are when we went to Fountain of Hope and Pestalozzi. This is because I not only had fun but I also learnt from the people I met.

My KF fellows are very kind and at the same time geniuses. We help each other in different areas and many of us are good in different subjects and other areas of life. Because of this we help control each when one is wrong."
