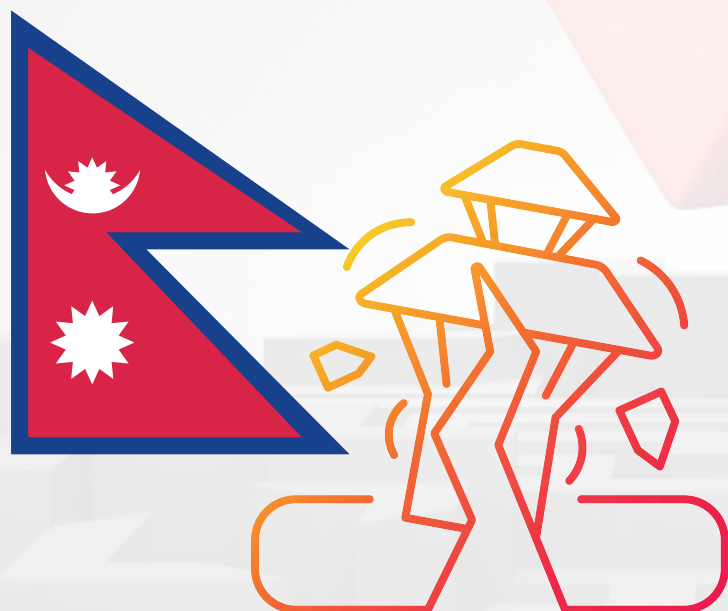

Women Empowerment

Acknowledging that genuine empowerment is essential for women to overcome societal barriers, claim their rightful place in a traditionally male-dominated world, and embrace leadership opportunities, RSKS India has been at the forefront of driving change. This year, the organization has proudly executed a series of impactful initiatives aimed at uplifting and empowering women.

STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

"When we empower women, we empower humanity." – Ban Ki-moon

Violence against women (VAW) represents one of the most severe violations of human rights, perpetuating inequality and suppressing progress. At RSKS India, we believe that breaking this cycle begins with awareness, education, and collective action.

Through innovative and community-driven initiatives, we have tirelessly worked to address this critical issue, envisioning a society where women live with dignity, safety, and freedom.

As part of the HER VOICE Campaign to combat violence against women, we conducted a series of impactful activities aimed at raising awareness, igniting conversations, and empowering individuals to stand against gender-based violence.



Key Activities and Outcomes:

- Mass Awareness Campaign: “Humari Awaz”- Engaging **1,750 students** across **35 schools**, this campaign inspired young minds through road rallies, poster competitions, storytelling sessions, signature drives, and creative activities. By involving students in such meaningful ways, the campaign fostered empathy and sparked a sense of responsibility to counter gender-based violence.
- Awareness Drive Against Child Marriage- Through targeted efforts, **244 slum dwellers, nomadic tribes, and rural families** across **eight locations** were sensitized about the social and legal consequences of child marriage. Community members actively participated, showing increased commitment to safeguarding the rights of young girls.



- Pushkar Fair Awareness Programs- At the renowned International Pushkar Fair 2023, **thousands of attendees** were engaged through puppet shows, camel cart displays, peer-to-peer conversations, and “My Selfie” campaigns. These creative methods brought pressing issues to the forefront, leaving a lasting impression on diverse audiences.



- Workshops on Ending Child Marriage: “My Childhood – My Rights” Campaign- Spanning **30 rural villages**, these workshops empowered **1,483 schoolchildren** through art competitions, road rallies, and storytelling sessions. The initiative not only informed children about their rights but also encouraged them to become advocates for change.

Participants received essential art supplies, and winners were recognized with sketchbooks, water bottles, and geometry sets, further encouraging their active participation.





Impacts: • **Increased Awareness:** **Thousands of individuals**, from school children to rural families, gained critical knowledge about the harmful impact of gender-based violence and child marriage.

- **Community Engagement:** By involving diverse groups—including students, parents, and fair attendees—the campaigns built a collective voice against **violence and early marriage**.
- **Empowerment through Creativity:** The use of art, storytelling, and cultural mediums provided a platform for self-expression and advocacy, particularly for **youth**.
- **Sustainable Change:** The campaigns have **inspired** participants to continue these conversations within their communities, creating ripples of awareness and long-term impact.



WOMEN'S SELF-HELP GROUPS: EMPOWERING THROUGH UNITY

Key Activities and Outcomes:

At RSKS India, we believe in the transformative power of collaboration to drive positive change. RSKS India proudly supports over **50 active women's SHGs**, mobilizing nearly **500 rural women** across various communities. These groups serve as pillars of both economic and social empowerment, offering livelihood opportunities and equipping women with essential skills in banking and financial management.

Empowered by micro-loans, the women have ventured into diverse enterprises in both farming and non-farming sectors, including:

- Farming initiatives: Azolla farming, kitchen gardening, vermicomposting.
- Non-farming activities: Cattle and fish husbandry, vegetable shops, and other small businesses.

These ventures not only drive economic growth but also contribute to sustainable community development, creating a ripple effect of empowerment.





Impacts: By uniting women under the SHG model, RSKS India is not just creating entrepreneurs but building a future where women are the drivers of social and economic change.

- **Entrepreneurial Success:** Every SHG member is actively engaged in a self-employment venture or small business, contributing to the **local economy**.
- **Breaking Stereotypes:** These women have emerged as **role models**, challenging and transforming conservative mindsets in rural communities.
- **Sectoral Contributions:** Rural women are making significant strides in both the **farming and non-farming** sectors, showcasing their versatility and determination.
- **Economic Independence:** Members have achieved **financial stability** and now contribute meaningfully to their family incomes, enhancing their households' quality of life.
- **Decision-Making Power:** Empowered by their economic contributions, women now actively participate in family **decision-making** processes.
- **Financial Literacy:** An impressive **90% of SHG members** visit their group's bank regularly, and all members are proficient in essential banking activities.
- **Community Support:** These groups have cultivated a strong sense of mutual care, fostering **solidarity** and collaboration among members.

BUILDING CHANGE THROUGH LIFE SKILLS, ENTREPRENEURSHIP, LEADERSHIP AND CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING

Key Activities and Outcomes:

At RSKS India, we believe that empowering women through entrepreneurship and leadership training is a catalyst for sustainable development. Our comprehensive training programs, spanning **457 rural villages/locations** and engaging **30,520 women and girls**, have focused on fostering self-reliance, boosting confidence, and nurturing leadership potential. Through engaging activities such as interactive games, hands-on tasks, group exercises, and structured lessons, participants gained valuable insights into entrepreneurship, capacity building, life skills, and leadership principles.



The programs were designed to develop critical abilities such as communication, decision-making, and problem-solving, empowering women and girls to take charge of their personal and professional lives. The training instilled self-awareness and self-confidence, enabling participants to recognize their potential as leaders of change within their families and communities.





Impacts:

- **30,520 women and girls** received intensive training in entrepreneurship, leadership, and life skills.
- **457 rural villages/locations** were covered, ensuring outreach to even the most remote areas.
- Over 80% of participants reported significant improvements in their **confidence and decision-making abilities**.
- 70% of women successfully initiated or expanded **small enterprises** within three months of training.
- 85% of participants acknowledged a stronger voice in **family and community decisions**.
- 60% of women and girls established **effective networks** within their communities, creating support systems for further development.
- A marked **40% increase in household incomes** was observed among participants actively pursuing entrepreneurship post-training.





EDUCATION

In a society where patriarchal norms often hinder the progress of girls, education becomes a vital remedy to empower, uplift, and create equal opportunities. RSKS India recognizes education as the foundation for building a progressive and inclusive society. Through innovative and impactful programs, we have worked relentlessly to illuminate the lives of marginalized children, particularly adolescent girls, ensuring they step into a future full of promise and potential.

PATHSHALA: A VALUE BASED EDUCATION SCHOOL

"When girls are educated, their countries become stronger and more prosperous." – Michelle Obama



Key Activities and Outcomes:

RSKS India's Pathshala Schools have become a transformative force for over **220 marginalized adolescent girls**, aged 10–19, across five remote rural areas. These schools provide not just academic instruction but a holistic education that empowers these girls to thrive in all aspects of life.

Academic and Personal Development:

The curriculum goes beyond traditional learning to include topics critical for personal growth and societal awareness, such as:

- ‘Good Touch-Bad Touch’ awareness and sexual health education
- Environmental conservation and anti-plastic initiatives
- Advocacy against child marriage
- Leadership and life skills training
- Moral values and discipline-building activities

Extracurricular Activities and Parental Engagement: Celebrating social days and festivals created a joyful and culturally enriched learning environment. Monthly Parent-Teacher Meetings ensured parents’ active involvement and understanding of their child’s progress.

Support for Basic Needs: To ease the challenges faced by these girls and their families, RSKS India provided: School uniforms, shoes and Essential educational materials like pen, copies, registers, pencil, eraser etc.





Impacts:

This holistic approach not only reignited the educational journeys of school dropouts and illiterate girls but also molded them into confident, skilled, and well-rounded individuals, ready to pursue mainstream education and future opportunities.

- **220 adolescent girls** across **5 rural areas** received access to value-based education.
- 95% of enrolled girls demonstrated marked improvement in **literacy and academic performance**.
- 90% of parents reported **increased awareness and confidence** in supporting their daughters' education.
- 77% of dropouts successfully **reintegrated into formal education** systems after completing the program.
- More than 92% of girls actively participated in **leadership roles** in their communities.
- Over 88% of girls showcased significant improvement in life skills, including **decision-making and self-confidence**.
- **100% of Pathshala School Girls** were educated about child marriage prevention, good touch-bad touch, and environmental conservation.

EDUCATION FOR EVERY GIRL

"Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."

Key Activities and Outcomes:

In Rajasthan, the journey of educating girls is fraught with obstacles such as financial hardships, societal conservatism, gender bias, and social evils. Recognizing these challenges, RSKS India launched the 'Education for Every Girl' initiative to address the stark inequalities in access to education. This year, the program extended its support to **2,436 rural girls** from **134 rural locations**, enabling them to step closer to a brighter and more equitable future.



The girls supported under this initiative belong to families engaged in farming, daily wage labor, masonry, truck driving, and other marginalized occupations. Identified through baseline surveys conducted in collaboration with school authorities and the RSKS India team, these girls were provided with essential resources to overcome barriers to education like:

Educational Materials: School bags, geometry boxes, stationery kits, school uniforms, and water bottles.

Nutritional Support: Food packets to meet basic dietary needs.

Financial Aid: Assistance with school fees, sports uniform & scholarships.

Hygiene Essentials: Sanitary napkins, handkerchiefs, and soaps to promote health and dignity.



These rural girls were also taught some important topics like Water, Sanitation & Hygiene, Sexual & Reproductive health, Life Skills & Leadership, Gender Equality etc through various activities and workshops.





Impacts:

- 2,436 rural girls from 134 rural locations received critical educational and hygiene support.
- 100% of supported girls were able to continue their education for the year without interruption.
- Over 90% of the girls achieved excellent marks in their exams, showcasing the transformative impact of sustained educational support.
- The initiative reached families engaged in farming, daily wage labor, masonry, and other marginalized sectors, fostering awareness about the value of educating girls.
- Topics on moral values, discipline, nutrition, and hygiene were incorporated, contributing to the girls' overall development.
- Post-project family engagement, a significant number of families reported a newfound commitment to prioritizing their daughters' education.





2. Educational and Practical Learning Activities: To ensure students understood the importance and utility of green energy, the program included:

- Thought-Provoking Lectures on energy conservation and environmental protection.
- Hands-On Training in solar power system maintenance and care, enabling practical knowledge of renewable energy systems.
- Interactive Engagement: Activities like "My Selfie with Solar" fostered personal connections with the concept of green energy.
- Energy-Saving Oath: Students pledged to adopt and advocate energy-saving practices in their homes and communities.

Impacts:

- **454 students** from four rural schools directly benefited from the installation of solar power systems and educational activities.
- The solar power systems reduced reliance on traditional energy sources, **saving an estimated 1,825 kWh** of electricity annually per school.
- Over 80% of participating students demonstrated an understanding of **energy conservation and solar technology** during follow-up evaluations.
- 90% of students pledged to actively **save energy** at home and in their communities.

ROSHNI: ILLUMINATING RURAL EDUCATION

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan (RSKS India) took a transformative step toward fostering environmental sustainability and energy conservation through its "5 kW Off-Grid Solar Power System Setup and Mass Awareness Program." This initiative empowered rural school students with knowledge and resources to embrace renewable energy and champion environmental protection. The program, conducted in **four rural villages**, reached **454 schoolchildren**, equipping them with the tools and awareness needed to become stewards of green energy and sustainable practices.

1. Solar Power Systems Installation: Four 5 kW off-grid solar power systems were installed in rural schools, providing an uninterrupted, sustainable energy source and reducing dependence on conventional energy.





- Each participating school reported a **10-15% reduction in energy costs**, which could now be reallocated to educational resources.
- The program sparked enthusiasm for **environmental preservation** among students, with many expressing a newfound interest in renewable energy technologies.
- Teachers and parents observed a noticeable shift in students' awareness and advocacy for **sustainable practices**.
- The schools became **role models** for neighboring institutions, with requests for similar installations and training programs.



SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD



At RSKS India, we firmly believe that economic empowerment serves as a catalyst for social transformation. By equipping women and girls with the tools to make informed decisions about their health, well-being, and families, we break down barriers and pave the way for a more equitable society. This year, our Sustainable Livelihood initiative focused on providing skill-based training to marginalized women and girls, empowering them to lead independent and dignified lives.

BUILD BRIGHT FUTURE FOR MARGINALIZED GIRLS & WOMEN

Key Activities and Outcomes:

In rural areas, where limited education and lack of opportunities hinder women and girls from securing jobs or starting their ventures, RSKS India launched a targeted skills development program.

Program Overview:

- **Participants:** A total of **182 women and girls**, aged 18-35, from five rural areas participated in the program.
- **Trades Offered:** Vocational training in **beautician services, bag making, and advanced garment making.**
- **Duration:** Spanning **3-5 months**, each course required participants to dedicate **5 hours daily** to training.
- **Training Model:** A blend of **practical sessions and theoretical lessons** to ensure comprehensive learning.



The program stood out by integrating value-added components to enhance participants confidence and employability:

- **Job Fairs:** Connecting participants with employment opportunities.
- **Capacity Building Sessions:** Equipping women with leadership and decision-making skills.
- **Life Skills Training:** Fostering resilience, financial literacy, and communication abilities.
- **Exhibitions and Hat Bazaars:** Providing a platform for women to showcase and sell their handmade products.
- **Skill Certification:** Recognizing achievements and opening doors to formal employment or entrepreneurship.

To ensure sustainability, RSKS India mobilized participants into Skill Net Groups, which hold monthly meetings to discuss job opportunities, address challenges, and foster collaboration among members.





Impacts:

- **182 women and girls trained** across five rural areas in non-agricultural trades, gaining practical skills and self-confidence.
- **85% of participants secured employment** or started their own businesses within six months of completing the program.
- Participants average **monthly income increased by 40%-60%**, contributing significantly to their families' financial stability.
- **100% of participants received skill certification**, boosting their credibility in the job market.
- Monthly Skill Net Group meetings enhanced collaboration, with over 90% of **participants regularly attending and actively contributing**.
- Participants showcased their creations in **8 exhibitions and 2 hat bazaars**, earning an additional collective income.
- The program fostered a shift in community perspectives, with 70% of participants reporting improved acceptance of **women's economic roles** in their families and villages.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR GIRLS & YOUNG WOMEN

Key Activities and Outcomes:

In rural villages where economic challenges often limit opportunities, RSKS India's Girls & Young Women's Entrepreneurship Development Program has become a beacon of hope. This year, the program empowered **182 young women and girls**, equipping them with the tools, knowledge, and confidence to launch, manage, and expand their entrepreneurial ventures. This initiative was designed to nurture budding and existing women entrepreneurs by providing comprehensive support and guidance:

- **Inspiring Success Stories:** Sharing real-life journeys of women entrepreneurs to motivate and encourage participants.
- **Interactive-Problem-Solving:** Addressing challenges, answering queries, and providing actionable solutions.
- **Breaking Gender Barriers:** Promoting equality and inclusivity in entrepreneurship ecosystems.

The program placed a strong emphasis on fostering the meaningful participation of women entrepreneurs in driving economic growth and sustainable development. By eliminating barriers to entrepreneurship and building confidence, these women and girls became catalysts for transformation in their communities.



Impacts:

- 182 girls and young women trained in rural entrepreneurship, enhancing their ability to manage and grow sustainable businesses.
- Over 90% reported increased financial independence, contributing meaningfully to their families' incomes.
- 75% successfully launched new ventures within six months of completing the program, ranging from handicrafts to small-scale retail.
- Participants created 58 direct jobs for others in their communities, amplifying the program's economic impact.
- 100% of participants gained confidence in public speaking, decision-making, and networking, equipping them to face future challenges.
- 40% of participants transitioned from informal work to structured and scalable business models.
- The program facilitated 12 community-based networking sessions, fostering collaboration and peer learning among women entrepreneurs.

FREE SEWING MACHINE DISTRIBUTION FOR SELF EMPLOYMENT

“You can’t use up creativity. The more you use, the more you have.” – Maya Angelou

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Free Sewing Machine Distribution for Self-Employment Program, an impactful step towards empowering economically disadvantaged women in rural communities. Through this program, **seven women** from six underserved villages were provided with sewing machines, unlocking the potential for sustainable income and self-reliance.

This addressed both economic and social challenges faced by these women, offering not only the tools but also the skills to transform their lives. This program epitomizes RSKS India’s vision of fostering **economic independence** and **promoting gender equality**. For these women, the sewing machines became a symbol of opportunity. From stitching garments for local markets to creating custom designs for clients, they began to see the fruits of their labor reflected in their **newfound confidence and financial contributions** to their families.



Impacts:

- **Seven women** from six rural villages received sewing machines and training.
- Each participant reported an increase in monthly household income, averaging **₹2,500-₹4,000** within the first three months.
- 100% of the participants **gained practical skills in tailoring** and sewing machine maintenance, ensuring the longevity of their tools.
- Three participants began offering tailoring services locally, establishing a **client base** within their communities.
- Two women expanded their ventures by **collaborating with local markets** to sell stitched garments, demonstrating entrepreneurial growth.
- All seven women contributed financially to their households, significantly **reducing financial stress** and improving living conditions.
- The participants expressed an enhanced sense of **self-worth and confidence**, inspiring other women in their villages to explore similar opportunities.





DISABILITY



People with disabilities often face compounded challenges in accessing essential resources such as rehabilitation, education, and employment, creating a cycle of dependency and poverty. RSKS India recognizes these obstacles and has committed itself to empowering individuals with disabilities (PwDs) by addressing their unique needs through holistic programs that foster Empowerment, Education, Livelihood, and Social & Health inclusion. These efforts aim to break barriers, enhance self-reliance, and cultivate a more inclusive and equitable society.

EMPOWERING PEOPLE LIVING WITH DISABILITIES

Key Activities and Outcomes:

This year, RSKS India successfully supported **35 individuals** with disabilities across all age groups, offering targeted assistance tailored to their diverse needs. The program also emphasized the importance of community support and awareness. RSKS India's dedicated efforts worked toward reshaping societal perceptions, encouraging inclusion, and helping these individuals unlock their potential. The program focused on:

Holistic Home-Based Support:

- Daily living exercises and personalized home-based activities to enhance independence.
- Educational sessions to teach essential life skills such as recognizing colors, personal grooming, counting, bathing, and eating habits.

Assistive Equipment Distribution:

- Free provision of mobility aids, prosthetics, and other essential tools through government and private schemes.
- Ensured that each PwD received equipment to improve their functionality and independence.

Livelihood and Social Integration:

- Livelihood training programs designed to empower PwDs with skills to contribute economically.
- Social inclusion initiatives to increase participation of PwDs in community life, fostering acceptance and awareness.

Impacts:

- **35 individuals** with disabilities received tailored support across age groups.
- 100% of participants demonstrated **improvement in daily living skills**, leading to enhanced independence.
- **20 PwDs** received free assistive equipment, improving mobility and quality of life.
- **10 children with disabilities** (CwDs) acquired vital skills through interactive educational sessions.
- 80% of participants reported an **increased sense of self-worth and societal inclusion**.
- 15 PwDs were introduced to **livelihood initiatives**, creating pathways for financial independence.
- Community awareness campaigns reached **500+ individuals**, fostering a more inclusive mindset.



ENVIRONMENT & SANITATION

Nature forms the foundation of life itself, yet its delicate balance faces unprecedented threats. Acknowledging the urgent need for action, RSKS India has spearheaded impactful environmental and sanitation programs throughout the year. Our mission is clear: to nurture a harmonious coexistence between humanity and nature and inspire global efforts for sustainability.

SAVE INNOCENT SPARROW BIRDS

"Every small wing adds to the flight of a balanced ecosystem."

Key Activities and Outcomes:

The once-thriving sparrow, a beloved symbol of biodiversity, is now vanishing at an alarming rate. Habitat destruction from deforestation, the proliferation of mobile towers, extensive pesticide usage, and the dominance of concrete structures have driven these gentle birds to the brink of extinction in some areas.

RSKS India responded with determination and compassion, launching a comprehensive campaign to reverse this decline. Our multi-pronged initiative focused on both awareness and action to restore the sparrow population:

Awareness Campaigns:

- Educated over **1,500 individuals** on the importance of conserving sparrows and the broader benefits of biodiversity.
- These efforts aimed to create **eco-conscious communities** ready to champion bird conservation.

Eco-Friendly Bird Houses and Feeders:

- Installed **341 eco-friendly wooden bird houses** in public spaces and distributed them to bird enthusiasts and environmental advocates.
- Positioned bird feeders nearby, ensuring sparrows had **access to nourishment**.

Sustainability Advocacy:

- Engaged with schools, local organizations, and communities to foster a culture of **environmental stewardship**.
- Promoted sustainable practices to **protect natural habitats** and mitigate human-induced harm.



Impacts:

- **Habitat Restoration:** Over **341 sparrows** have made these bird houses their sanctuary, ensuring a safe environment for nesting and rearing young.
- **Rapid Adaptation:** Within just 1-2 weeks, **sparrows began building nests** in the installed bird houses, demonstrating the program's immediate efficacy.
- **Population Growth:** A measurable **increase in the sparrow population** has been observed, reflecting the initiative's tangible success.
- **Protection Against Threats:** The sturdy wooden houses provided vital **protection from predators** and hunters, ensuring the birds' safety.
- **Nourishment Support:** Strategically placed feeders offered **consistent access to food**, bolstering the health and survival of the sparrows.
- **Community Engagement:** The initiative **inspired a growing community of bird enthusiasts**, with an increasing number of individuals requesting bird houses from RSKS India to contribute to the cause.

ADOPT A TREE: PROTECT ENVIRONMENT & EARTH

"Someone is sitting in the shade today because someone planted a tree long ago." – **Warren Buffett**

Understanding that the environment is the foundation of life, RSKS India undertook the 'Adopt A Tree: Protect Environment & Earth' initiative to foster environmental stewardship and secured a healthier planet for future generations. Throughout the year, RSKS India expanded its reach across **32 rural villages**, enlightening over **3,000 individuals**, including schoolchildren, about the urgent need for environmental protection and sustainability. This educational campaign employed a range of creative tools and activities, such as:

- **Story Sessions:** Narratives highlighting the relationship between humans and nature.
- **Flipcharts and Flipbooks:** Visual aids illustrating the benefits of tree plantation.
- **Public Rallies:** Mobilizing communities to actively participate in protecting their environment.
- **Interactive Workshops:** Engaging sessions for students on how trees contribute to ecological balance.

RSKS India transformed awareness into action by planting 1,500 fruitful and shade-giving trees in collaboration with local residents and schoolchildren. These trees were strategically planted in schools, common lands, and public spaces to maximize their ecological and social benefits.

Why These Trees Matter:

- **Shade & Oxygen:** Providing relief and purifying the air in rural areas.
- **Business Opportunities:** Offering fruits and products that can support local livelihoods.
- **Improved Nutrition:** Enhancing food security through nutritious yields.
- **Climate Resilience:** Mitigating the impact of extreme weather by stabilizing the local ecosystem.





Impacts:

- **Communities Engaged:** Awareness campaigns reached over **3,000 individuals** in **32 villages**.
- **Trees Planted:** A **total of 1,500 trees**, including fruit-bearing and shade-providing species, were successfully planted.
- **Sustainability Initiatives:** Inspired over **150 households** to plant and care for trees in their own spaces.
- **Environmental Benefits:** The trees collectively will absorb approximately **30 tons of CO2 annually**, contributing significantly to carbon sequestration.
- **Local Livelihoods:** Enabled potential annual fruit yields of **1-2 tons**, supporting economic growth in rural communities.



TOTAL CLEAN INDIA CAMPAIGN

"Cleanliness is next to godliness." – Mahatma Gandhi

Key Activities and Outcomes:

RSKS India took a decisive stride toward fostering cleanliness and hygiene awareness through its impactful Total Clean India Campaign. The campaign reached 9 rural schools, actively engaging 442 schoolchildren, alongside their teachers and community volunteers, in transformative activities. The initiative began with school cleaning drives, where students actively participated in tidying their school premises. This hands-on experience fostered a sense of responsibility and pride in their immediate environment, laying the foundation for long-term behavioral change. The work done was:

- **Engaging Awareness Sessions:** Interactive discussions using flip charts and educational games like snake and ladder to convey the importance of hygiene and cleanliness in an accessible and memorable way.
- **Public Rallies:** Vibrant processions with banners and slogans spread the message of cleanliness to the wider community, reinforcing the campaign's outreach.
- **Oath-Taking Ceremony:** Students pledged to uphold cleanliness and hygiene in their daily lives, symbolizing their commitment to positive change.
- **Practical Hygiene Training:** Interactive sessions provided practical tips on maintaining cleanliness, emphasizing its role in fostering health and well-being.

Impacts:

- **442 Schoolchildren Inspired:** Students developed a sense of ownership in **maintaining their schools' cleanliness**, becoming role models in their communities.
- **9 Schools Transformed:** Thorough cleaning drives **enhanced hygiene standards and encouraged sustainable maintenance practices**.
- **Community Engagement Amplified:** Public rallies extended the campaign's influence, **impacting hundreds of local residents** with the message of cleanliness.
- **Behavioral Shift Instilled:** Oath-taking ceremonies and practical training sessions helped **integrate cleanliness and hygiene into daily routines**.



Understanding the critical role of agriculture and livestock in sustaining rural livelihoods, Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan did a series of impactful initiatives aimed at addressing the challenges faced by farmers. With agriculture increasingly threatened by declining productivity and unsustainable practices, RSKS India has adopted a holistic approach to empower rural farmers, enhance productivity, and foster economic resilience.

EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS: AGRICULTURE LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE

"Agriculture is the most healthful, most useful, and most noble employment of man."

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Recognizing the pivotal role of women in rural economies, RSKS India organized Five-Day Skill Development Training on Animal Husbandry and Organic Fertilizer (Vermicomposting) for Self-Help Group (SHG) members across six rural villages. The training program engaged **313 SHG members** and combined theoretical insights with practical applications. Expert resource persons conducted interactive sessions supported by diagrams, flipcharts, and video presentations, ensuring a comprehensive understanding of:

- **Advanced Animal Husbandry Practices:** Improving livestock care, feeding techniques, and productivity.
- **Organic Fertilizer Techniques:** Understanding the preparation, benefits, and application of vermicomposting to enhance soil fertility and crop yield.



Impacts:

- **Knowledge Enhancement:** **313 SHG members** gained invaluable insights into sustainable practices, empowering them to improve livestock health and agricultural productivity.
- **Collective Action:** Inspired by the training, participants committed to implementing these practices, fostering a culture of **shared learning and mutual support** within their SHGs.
- **Economic Growth:** With improved livestock management and the use of organic fertilizers, women can expect **increased agricultural yields** and reduced dependency on chemical inputs, thereby boosting income.
- **Sustainability Awareness:** Participants developed a deeper understanding of **environmentally friendly practices**, aligning their livelihoods with ecological conservation.



FERTILIZER, SEEDS & FARMING MATERIAL DISTRIBUTION

"The farmer has to be an optimist or he wouldn't still be a farmer." — Will Rogers

With limited financial resources, many farmers faced the harsh reality of being unable to purchase seeds, fertilizers, or essential farming materials—key elements for maintaining their agricultural activities.



RSKS India conducted the Fertilizer, Seeds & Farming Material Distribution Program to provide immediate and impactful assistance to 32 marginal farmers of 6 different rural villages facing financial distress. The program aimed to equip farmers with the resources they needed to cultivate their fields, sustain their livelihoods, and secure a brighter future for their families.

Impacts:

- **Increased Crop Yield:** The distributed seeds and fertilizers helped farmers achieve up to a **35% improvement in crop production** compared to previous harvests.
- **Financial Security:** The program alleviated financial stress, enabling farmers to **meet household expenses and reinvest in agriculture**.
- **Food Security:** The improved harvest ensured **sufficient food supply for the families** and a surplus for market sale.
- **Economic Upliftment:** On average, **farmers earned 20–30% higher profits** due to increased productivity and premium pricing of their produce.
- **Enhanced Savings:** Farmers **saved approximately ₹5,000–7,000 per family**, which they reinvested in future farming activities.
- **Community Outreach:** The program indirectly **benefited over 160 family members**, fostering financial stability and improved living conditions.



CHILD RIGHTS & WELFARE

Many children from impoverished communities, including those living in slums or on the streets, are deprived of the joy and innocence of a traditional childhood. To address this, RSKS India has launched the "Make a Wish for Street & Slum Children" project, a year-round initiative dedicated to spreading happiness and improving the lives of these underprivileged children. The project features a range of impactful programs designed to uplift and bring joy to these young hearts, including:



FESTIVALS CELEBRATIONS WITH SLUM & STREET CHILDREN

"Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all the darkness." – Desmond Tutu

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Every child, regardless of their background, holds the innate desire to experience the joy of festivals, a time when communities come together to celebrate tradition, culture, and shared happiness.

Yet, for many slum and street children, these celebrations remain a distant dream, hindered by their harsh living conditions.

RSKS India has been a beacon of hope in fulfilling these dreams, ensuring that these children are not left behind during major festivals such as Holi, Dussehra, Diwali, and Christmas. Through our dedicated efforts, we have brought these festivities to life for over **700 children across 28 locations**, creating an atmosphere of joy, unity, and inclusion.

Our festival celebration programs included a wide array of festive items to bring smiles to these children's faces:

- **550 fancy dresses** for girls and boys, allowing them to feel special on these occasions.
- **550 packets of firecrackers and 400 water guns**, adding fun and excitement.
- **700 food packets and 700 sweet packets** to nourish and delight them.
- **400 color packets and 70 soft toys** to engage them in playful celebration.
- **Santa caps, hairbands, balloons, and more** to make the celebrations truly festive.

Impacts:

- **700+ children participated** in the celebration of major festivals across 28 locations.
- 550 fancy dresses were distributed along with firecrackers, providing children with the opportunity to **dress up and feel special**.
- 700 food packets and 700 sweet packets ensured that children had **access to nutritious and celebratory meals**.
- 400 color packets, water guns and 70 soft toys were given, promoting **creativity and fun**.



NUTRITIOUS, PROTEINS & VITAMINS FOOD AWARENESS & DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM

"Let food be thy medicine and medicine be thy food." – Hippocrates

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Children living in slums and on the streets often face serious health challenges due to inadequate nutrition, with deficiencies in essential proteins, vitamins, and other vital nutrients.

RSKS India has made it our mission to address these issues by not only providing nutritious food but also raising awareness about the importance of a balanced diet for children's growth and well-being.

To promote better health, we reached over **650 slum and street children across 26 locations**, offering them not only essential food kits but also educating them about the importance of proteins, vitamins, and nutritious food. These food kits included soybean, dalia, moong dal, rajma, and whole black gram, all of which were carefully selected to meet the dietary needs of the children. The distribution of these food items was complemented by workshops for the mothers of these children, equipping them with the knowledge to prepare nourishing meals at home. The program brought immense joy to these children, who danced and sang with happiness as they received their food kits.

Impacts:

- **650+ children and their families** were reached across 26 locations.
- Food kits containing essential items like soybean, dalia, moong dal, rajma, and whole black gram were distributed, **enhancing the nutritional intake** of these children.
- **500+ mothers** were trained on cooking nutritious meals, ensuring long-term dietary improvements for their children.
- The program helped raise awareness about the **importance of proteins, vitamins, and a balanced diet**, making it an educational initiative as well.
- Over 90% of the families reported **improved health and energy levels** among the children after implementing the dietary changes.
- **Community engagement increased**, as children actively participated in nutrition-focused activities, spreading the message of healthy eating.



VALUE BASED EDUCATION CAMPS

“The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others.”- Mahatma Gandhi

Key Activities and Outcomes:

This year, RSKS India took proactive steps by organizing Value-Based Education Camps across 24 different slum and street areas, where incidents of such harmful behaviors were prevalent.

These camps aimed to equip over **550 children** with the foundational knowledge and skills they need to navigate life with dignity, respect, and responsibility.

Through engaging activities such as flipcharts, story-telling sessions, flipbooks, snake and ladder games, and video shows, the camps created an interactive learning environment. The focus was on imparting critical values such as respect for elders, the importance of **discipline, understanding the concept of good touch-bad touch, and developing basic life skills**. These activities were designed to inspire children to embrace positive behavior and contribute to their personal growth.

Importantly, these camps also served as a platform for parents to gain valuable insights into topics such as life skills, discipline, good touch-bad touch, and the importance of education. By encouraging **parental involvement**, RSKS India aimed to foster a supportive learning environment both at the camp and at home, ensuring that children received continuous guidance from their families.

Impacts:

- **550+ children participated** in the education camps across 24 slum and street areas.
- Interactive educational tools such as flipcharts, story-telling sessions, and games were used to engage children in **meaningful learning**.
- **80% of parents actively participated**, ensuring that the lessons learned were reinforced at home.
- 90% of children reported an **increased understanding of important life skills, including discipline, respect, and safety**.
- The camps provided vital education on good touch-bad touch, reaching over 550 children, helping them to **recognize safe boundaries and promote personal well-being**.
- **Over 500 parents gained valuable insights** into discipline and life skills, which they could apply in their daily interactions with their children.



WARMNESS IN THE WINTER PROGRAM

“One person can make a difference, and everyone should try.”- John F. Kennedy

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Children living in slum and street environments often face harsh and challenging conditions, especially during the winter months. Their limited access to proper clothing exacerbates the health risks posed by the cold, leaving them vulnerable to illness and discomfort.

RSKS India's Warmth in the Winter Program, which reached over **550 children across 23 slum and street locations**. This initiative provided more than just physical warmth—it sought to offer these children a sense of dignity, care, and the opportunity to experience the basic comforts that many take for granted. As part of this effort, we distributed essential winter clothing and food items to the children to shield them from the harsh winter weather. Each child received a package that included:

- **A warm tracksuit**, providing much-needed insulation.
- **A woolen cap** to protect against the cold.
- **A crocs set and warm hand gloves**, ensuring that their hands and feet stayed warm.
- **A delicious food packet**, which included special treats like laddu, til laddu, and lai, bringing joy and nourishment to these children during the winter months.

Impacts:

- **550+ children benefited** from winter clothing and nutritional support across **23 slum and street locations**.
- 550 warm tracksuits, woolen caps, crocs sets, and hand gloves were distributed, ensuring that **children stayed protected against the cold**.
- Over 700 food packets containing laddu, til laddu, and lai were distributed, **providing nourishment and a sense of festive joy**.
- 95% of children reported feeling more **comfortable and healthier** during the winter months, with fewer instances of cold-related illnesses.
- The program **reached 500+ families**, engaging parents in discussions about health, winter care, and the importance of nutrition.
- 90% of parents **expressed a sense of relief**, knowing their children were better equipped to face the cold weather.



HEALTH



By empowering these women and girls with knowledge, we not only addressed their immediate health needs but also helped to break the cycle of stigma and misinformation surrounding menstruation.

Impacts:

- 1,500 sanitary napkins were distributed, ensuring hygienic menstrual practices for 537 women and girls.
- Reached 20 rural and slum locations, significantly improving access to menstrual health resources.
- 85% of participants reported adopting healthier menstrual hygiene practices following the workshops.
- Over 90% of participants expressed increased awareness of sexual and reproductive health issues.
- Community engagement resulted in 35% more women and girls attending subsequent sessions than anticipated, showing growing interest and trust.
- Mothers and caregivers actively participated, creating a ripple effect of awareness within families and communities.



For over three decades, RSKS India has worked tirelessly to address the systemic healthcare challenges faced by impoverished and marginalized communities. In a country where access to quality health services remains a privilege for the few, our mission has been to bring healthcare and awareness to the many who are often overlooked. This year, we made significant strides, focusing on women's health through initiatives like:

BE FREE: HAPPY PERIOD WITH SANITARY NAPKINS

“Knowledge is power. Information is liberating. Education is the premise of progress, in every society, in every family.” - Kofi Annan

Key Activities and Outcomes:

In 2023-2024, we conducted a comprehensive initiative to promote healthy menstruation practices among women and girls in these underserved areas. Through awareness campaigns and the distribution of 1,500 sanitary napkins to 537 women and girls across 20 locations and villages, we aimed to foster positive, lasting change.

Our approach included more than just distribution. Using interactive and engaging tools such as educational aprons, video stories, consultations, flipcharts, and card sheets, we educated participants on essential topics like:

- The importance of menstrual hygiene
- Myths and misconceptions surrounding menstruation
- Sexual and reproductive health awareness
- Proper disposal methods for sanitary products



Impacts:

- 32 MDR & XDR TB patients received monthly food packets, ensuring sustained nutritional support.
- 100% of patients reported improved energy levels and better adherence to treatment protocols.
- 75% of beneficiaries showed significant health improvements within six months of receiving support.
- More than 60% of patients' families expressed relief, as the program reduced their financial burden for food.
- Community awareness about TB management increased through educational sessions conducted alongside distributions.



NUTRITIOUS FOOD PACKET DISTRIBUTION TO SERIOUS PATIENTS SUFFERING FROM T.B.

"Of all the forms of inequality, injustice in health care is the most shocking and inhumane."
– Martin Luther King Jr.

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Proper nutrition, coupled with effective medication, plays a critical role in the recovery journey for TB patients. Yet, for many, the financial burden of obtaining protein-rich, nutritious food makes recovery an uphill battle. This year, we provided monthly nutrition food packets to 32 TB patients, including MDR and XDR cases.

These beneficiaries, predominantly daily wage workers, laborers, painters, marginal farmers, and mine workers, face immense socio-economic challenges that hinder their access to essential health resources. The nutrition food packets provided by RSKS India contain essentials such as soybeans, eggs, rajma, oats, black gram, promoting a healthy and speedy recovery for these patients.

RSKS India went beyond merely distributing food packets. Our team:

- Conducted regular health monitoring to track the progress of patients until recovery.
- Educated patients and their families about the importance of nutrition in combating TB.
- Collaborated with local health workers to ensure proper adherence to TB medication.

"The greatest wealth is health." – Virgil

Key Activities and Outcomes:

To combat mosquito-borne diseases, RSKS India conducted a Mass Awareness Program combined with the distribution of mosquito nets to vulnerable street, slum, and nomadic families. Over the course of the year, the program reached 325 families, benefiting approximately 950 individuals across 12 slum and street locations.

Using interactive tools and activities, the program emphasized the importance of prevention and early treatment of mosquito-borne illnesses:



- Charts and flipcharts illustrated the life cycle of mosquitoes and ways to disrupt it.
- A snake-and-ladder game made learning about mosquito-borne diseases engaging and fun for children and adults alike.
- Storytelling sessions highlighted real-life scenarios of individuals successfully combating these diseases through preventive measures.

To provide immediate protection, RSKS India distributed 325 mosquito nets to nomadic families and slum dwellers. These nets act as a life-saving barrier against disease-carrying mosquitoes, offering families a safe space to rest without fear.



Impacts:

- 325 families, comprising 950 individuals, received life-saving information on preventing and treating mosquito-borne diseases.
- 325 mosquito nets were distributed, ensuring safer nights for families vulnerable to mosquito bites.
- 80% of participants reported an increase in awareness about the importance of maintaining hygienic surroundings.
- Over 90% of families committed to adopting preventive measures shared during the program.
- The initiative empowered 100+ children, who, through games and stories, became ambassadors for spreading awareness within their communities.



WARM BLANKET DISTRIBUTION TO STREET, NOMADIC, POOR PEOPLE DURING WINTER

"Kindness is like snow – it beautifies everything it covers." – Kahlil Gibran

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Winter is especially brutal for individuals living without proper shelter—those who are homeless, nomadic, or struggling in poverty. This year, the Warm Blanket Distribution Program reached 255 homeless, poor, and nomadic individuals across 11 locations, offering them relief from the relentless chill of winter. The program provided high-quality warm blankets, ensuring that each recipient had a dependable means to stay warm. By prioritizing individuals most at risk—elderly people, children, and those with chronic health conditions—RSKS India extended its care to those who needed it most.



Impacts:

- 255 individuals received warm blankets, safeguarding them against harsh winter conditions.
- Beneficiaries were identified across 11 slum, street, and nomadic locations to ensure broad outreach.
- 90% of recipients reported improved comfort and reduced cold-related illnesses within two months.
- Over 60 elderly individuals and 40 children were among those protected, highlighting the program's focus on vulnerable groups.
- Local healthcare workers noted a decline in cold-related ailments among recipients in targeted areas.
- 85% of beneficiaries expressed gratitude, sharing that the blanket distribution restored hope during a difficult season.



ROSHNI: PROVIDE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

"Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness." – Desmond Tutu

Key Activities and Outcomes:

In the lives of slum and street families, darkness often extends beyond the absence of light—it represents the daily struggles of unsafe environments, hindered productivity, and a lack of opportunities. ROSHNI: Provide Light in the Darkness project of RSKS India, delivered sustainable lighting solutions to those who need it most.

The initiative began with a meticulous survey of slum and street areas to identify family in dire need of sustainable lighting solutions. A solar light unit was distributed to the family, ensuring maximum impact. The unit included a high-quality solar panel, rechargeable battery, and energy-efficient LED light, designed to function seamlessly with minimal maintenance.



Impacts:

- The family, comprising over 6 individuals, received solar light, significantly improving their quality of life.
- The beneficiaries reported enhanced safety and security during nighttime, especially women and children.
- The solar lights enabled the children to study after dark, contributing to their education.
- By switching to solar energy, families saved an average of INR 300 per month, previously spent on kerosene or candles.



CLEAN WATER RO SUPPORT TO SCHOOL

"Thousands have lived without love, not one without water." – W.H. Auden

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Access to clean drinking water is a fundamental right, yet rural schools in India often struggle to provide this basic necessity to their students. This year, RSKS India successfully installed a Reverse Osmosis (RO) water purification system at a School in a rural area where potable water was previously a scarce resource.

The project not only provided access to safe drinking water but also raised awareness about hygiene and the importance of clean water in promoting overall well-being. RSKS India deployed a team of skilled technicians to install the RO system in a centrally accessible location within the school premises. This ensured that clean water was readily available to all 280 students and 12 staff members.

Impacts:

- 280 students and 12 staff members now have daily access to safe and clean drinking water.
- Improved attendance: Teachers reported a decrease in waterborne illnesses among students within three months of the RO installation.
- 100% of students participated in hygiene awareness sessions, fostering better health practices.
- The RO system has the capacity to filter 500 liters of water per day, meeting the school's daily requirements.
- The initiative is projected to prevent the emission of 10 kg of plastic waste monthly, previously generated by bottled water usage.
- 90% of students reported feeling more active and focused in class after accessing clean water.

TARPAULIN SHELTER RELIEF TO THE SLUM DWELLERS, NOMADIC & STREET FAMILIES DURING THE HARSH RAINFALL FOR SAFE HAVEN



“Now, my children and I can sleep without fear of the rain. We feel safer and healthier.” - A RSKS beneficiary

Key Activities and Outcomes:

For families living in slums, on streets, or as part of nomadic communities, the arrival of monsoons often signals a season of struggle and despair. This year, RSKS India distributed tarpaulin sheets to 300 families across 11 slum and street locations, ensuring they had a secure refuge from the elements. The program focused on families who lacked even basic shelter, prioritizing women, children, and the elderly—those most at risk during harsh rainfall.

Each tarpaulin sheet, made from high-quality, durable material, provided a temporary yet effective solution for shielding families from heavy rains and protecting their limited belongings. For many, this simple intervention became a symbol of hope and resilience during trying times.



Impacts:

- 300 families (approximately 1,350 individuals) received tarpaulin sheets for weather protection.
- Prevented exposure-related illnesses, with a reduction in reported cases of colds, fever, and respiratory infections among beneficiaries.
- Over 80% of recipients felt safer, particularly women and children, during heavy rainfall.
- The intervention safeguarded belongings such as food, clothing, and school supplies for 100% of the families served.
- Provided emergency relief to 80 children, ensuring their health and safety during the monsoon.
- Enabled 15 elderly & disabled individuals to remain protected and dry, reducing their vulnerability to the weather.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE & MATERIALS DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM FOR AUSPICIOUS MARRIAGE OF HELPLESS, ORPHAN AND DEPRIVED COMMUNITY GIRLS



“These gifts are more than items—they are a lifeline,” - RSKS beneficiary

Key Activities and Outcomes:

Marriage, a momentous occasion in life, often brings challenges for orphaned and financially deprived rural girls who lack the means to celebrate this event with dignity. RSKS India's Financial Assistance & Materials Distribution Program supported auspicious marriages for the most vulnerable.

This year, the initiative touched the lives of 4 orphaned and underprivileged girls from 3 rural villages, ensuring they could step into their new chapters with confidence, dignity, and community support. With meticulous planning, the organization provided these young women with essential materials like home appliances, utensils, blankets, and other daily essentials that would aid in setting up their married lives.

Impacts:

- 4 orphaned or financially disadvantaged girls received comprehensive marriage support.
- 3 rural villages were engaged in the program, promoting community solidarity and awareness.
- Each beneficiary received over 20 essential items, empowering them to begin married life with dignity.
- More than 1500 community members participated in the ceremonies, providing blessings and encouragement.
- The program alleviated financial stress for families, saving an estimated ₹60,000 per wedding on basic essentials.
- Enhanced emotional well-being and community integration for 100% of the beneficiaries.





CAMPAIGN & ADVOCACY

Campaigns and advocacy are the lifeblood of community engagement, enabling people to become active participants in shaping a brighter tomorrow. RSKS India leveraged the power of these tools to raise awareness, foster inclusion, and create lasting impacts through a series of festivals and social awareness celebrations throughout the year.

FESTIVALS & SOCIAL DAYS CELEBRATION

Celebrating festivals and observing significant social days not only foster unity but also highlight the importance of key societal issues. RSKS India's celebrations were a vibrant blend of fun, learning, and advocacy. This year, the organization commemorated 30+ festivals and social days, engaging people from diverse backgrounds and age groups to spread awareness and foster a sense of togetherness. These celebrations were not just events but platforms for education, empowerment, and joy. Activities included:

- Poster competitions to creatively express awareness.
- Workshops and street plays to discuss pressing social issues.
- Puppet shows and road shows to captivate and inform rural audiences.
- Cultural events and sports activities to foster community bonding.
- Interactive discussions on the significance of the day and its relevance to the community.

Gifts, rewards, and recognition were offered to participants, making the celebrations both meaningful and memorable.

Impacts:

- 2351 individuals from rural areas, slums, and streets directly participated in the celebrations.
- Programs spanned 57 different locations/villages, ensuring widespread outreach.
- Over 30 diverse festivals and awareness days were celebrated with enthusiasm and purpose.
- 85+ cultural and educational activities (street plays, puppet shows, and workshops) conducted.
- 45% of participants reported an increased understanding of the importance of these social days.
- A significant rise in participation from Pathshala schoolgirls, rural women, and slum/street children, fostering inclusivity.



DISASTER RELIEF



This year, communities across Rajasthan faced the harrowing impact of the Biporjoy Cyclone, which disrupted lives, livelihoods, and hopes. Recognizing the immense challenges posed by this natural disaster, Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan (RSKS India) swiftly mobilized resources and implemented the Biporjoy Cyclone Humanitarian Relief Campaign. This comprehensive initiative was designed to safeguard lives and livelihoods, addressing immediate needs while laying the foundation for recovery and resilience.

RATION/GROCERY PACKETS & HYGIENE KIT DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY FAMILIES

"We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." – Winston Churchill

Key Activities and Outcomes:

The aftermath of the Biporjoy Cyclone left thousands of families grappling with food insecurity, job loss, and depleted resources. To address this pressing crisis, RSKS India carried out a large-scale Ration/Grocery Packets and Hygiene Kit Distribution Program across 27 villages, slums, and streets. The work done under this was:

- **Food Relief:** RSKS India provided 28,820 kg of ration/grocery supplies, including essential items such as rice, lentils, flour, cooking oil, sugar, and spices. These supplies ensured that families could meet their nutritional needs during this challenging period.
- **Hygiene Kits:** To promote health and sanitation, each family received hygiene kits containing soap, toothpaste, sanitary napkins, and disinfectants.
- **Targeted Support:** The program reached 1441 vulnerable families, safeguarding the food security and well-being of approximately 6000 individuals affected by the cyclone.





Impacts:

- Distributed 28,820 kg of essential food supplies to families in need.
- Provided aid to 1441 families across 27 locations, directly benefiting 6000+ individuals.
- Delivered 1441 hygiene kits, addressing critical health and sanitation concerns.
- Ensured 80% of beneficiaries had immediate access to nutritious meals and hygiene essentials post-disaster.
- Partnered with local administrations and volunteers, mobilizing 150+ community members for efficient aid distribution.
- Conducted awareness sessions on disaster preparedness, reaching over 1200 individuals.



SHELTER & HYGIENE KIT RELIEF MATERIAL DISTRIBUTION TO SLUM DWELLERS, NEEDY AND DEPRIVED FAMILIES

Key Activities and Outcomes:

In response to the devastating Biporjoy Cyclone, RSKS India did a comprehensive relief initiative, focusing on providing critical shelter and hygiene support to 650 vulnerable families living in 24 slum and street locations. These families, already grappling with poverty, were hit hardest by the cyclone's destructive force. The Shelter & Hygiene Kit Relief Program sought to offer immediate relief, protection, and dignity to those most in need during this catastrophic event.

Targeted Relief: The program specifically targeted slum dwellers, needy families, and deprived communities who were exposed to the worst effects of the cyclone.

Shelter Kits: Each family received a Shelter Kit, which included:

- 1 HDPE Tarpaulin Sheet (waterproof, durable material providing temporary shelter)
- 1 HDPE Ground Sheet (for ground insulation)
- 1 Mosquito Net (protection from disease-carrying mosquitoes)
- 1 Bucket (for water storage)

Hygiene Kits: To ensure health and sanitation, families also received a Hygiene Kit that contained:

- 2 Bathing Soaps, 2 Washing Soaps
- 4 Tooth Brushes, 4 Toothpastes
- 1 Packet of Sanitary Napkins

Timely Delivery: These relief materials were distributed strategically to reach 650 families in the immediate aftermath of the cyclone, ensuring they had the essentials for survival during the harsh conditions.



Impacts:

- **650 vulnerable families** received vital shelter and hygiene kits in the aftermath of the cyclone.
- **2,600 individuals** (approximately 4 per family) benefited directly from the relief materials.
- Distributed **650 tarpaulin sheets**, providing temporary shelter and protection from the elements.
- Delivered **650 mosquito nets**, ensuring protection from vector-borne diseases such as malaria.
- Supplied **2,600 hygiene items** (soaps, toothbrushes, toothpaste) to enhance sanitation and prevent disease outbreaks.
- 100% of beneficiaries reported that the relief materials significantly improved their **quality of life** during the cyclone recovery phase.

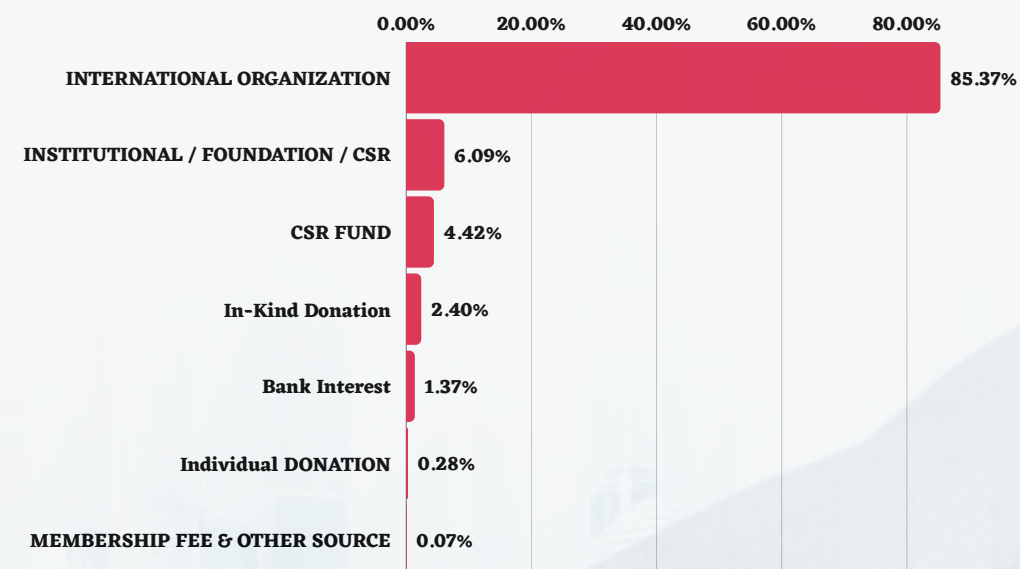


Expenditure Breakdown

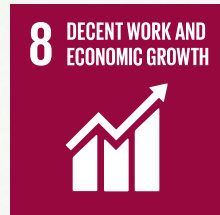

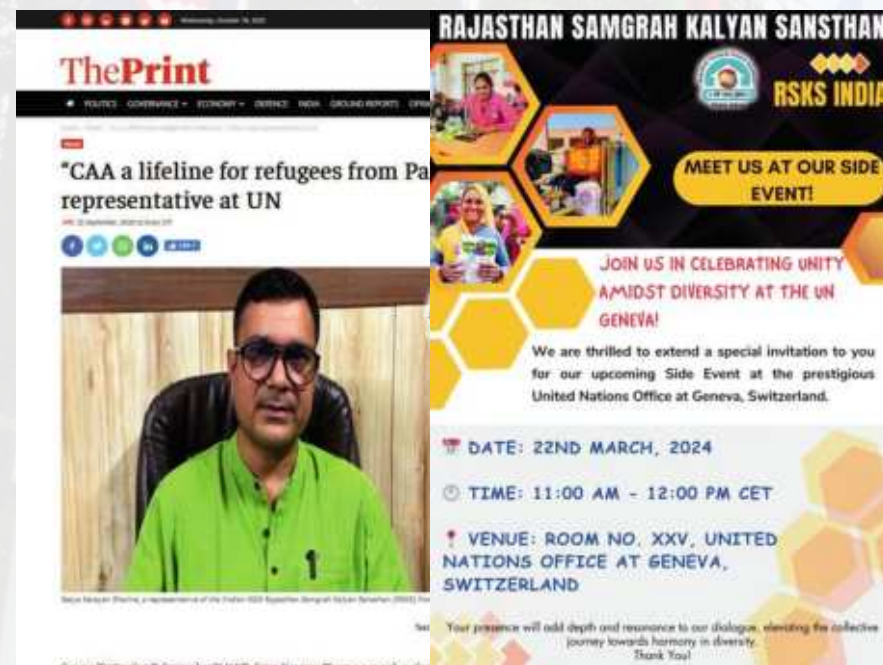

- Four written statements, highlighting innovative approaches to inclusive development.

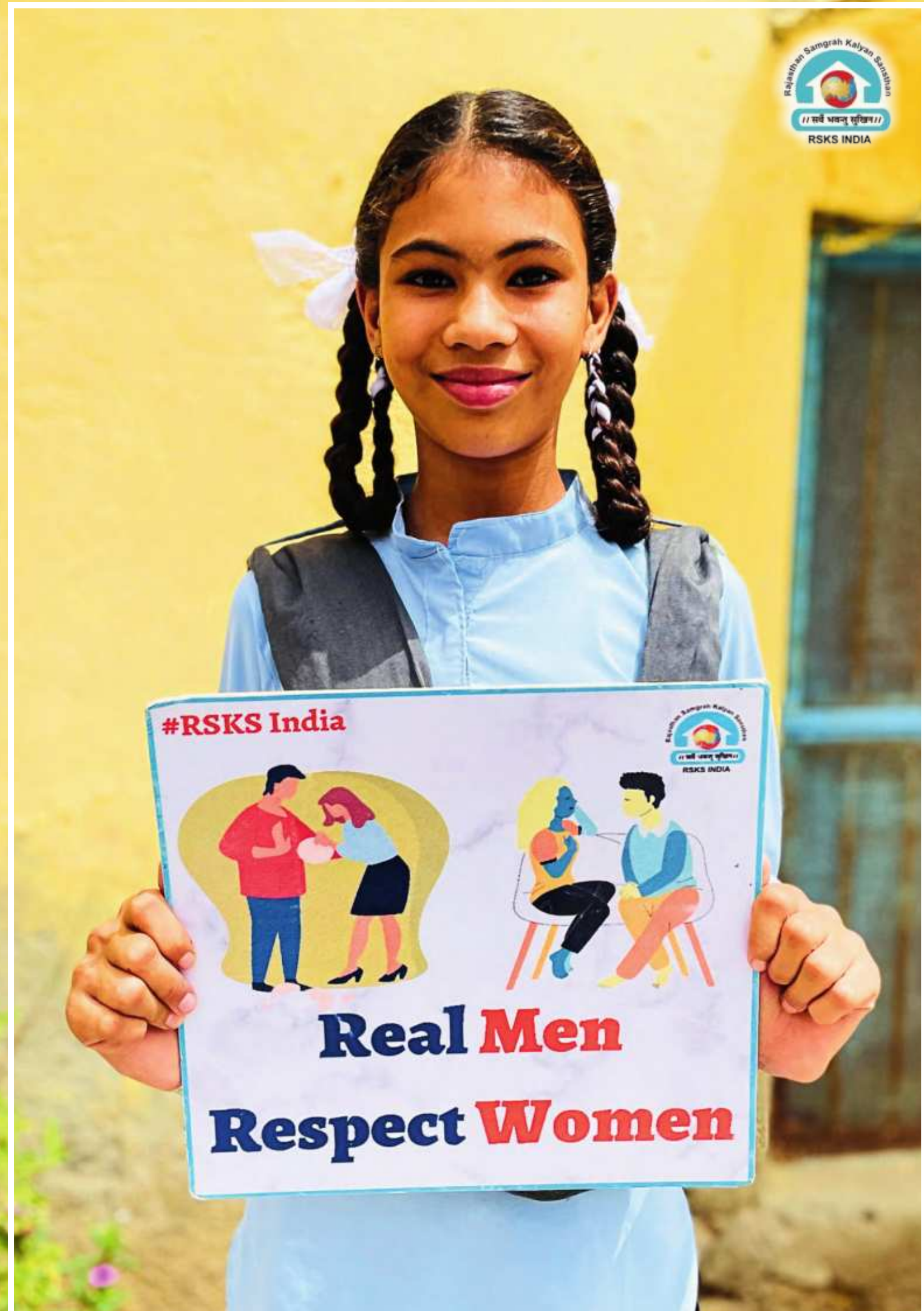
