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Temporary Shelter

The Costa Rican Association for Children with Cleft Lip and Palate (LPH) was founded by Dr. Guevara Fallas 34 years ago. He also founded the Cleft Lip & Palate Clinic at Children's Hospital 50 years ago.

LPH is a non-profit organization, with the purpose of providing support for cleft lip and palate (CLP) patients to complete their long-term treatment and to be productive and fully capable members of the Costa Rican society.

These two institutions worked collaboratively to implement comprehensive cleft care, with the goal of reaching isolated indigenous communities. Upon Dr. Fallas' retirement in 2010, the Hospital made changes and rehabilitation care services were no longer exclusively for CLP patients. Since then, LPH has managed to provide support services such as dentistry, speech and language therapy (SLP) and counseling without disrupting the multidisciplinary approach and coordination with the Children's Hospital.

Our shelter receives more than 25 families every month, either for a surgery or an appointment at the Hospital.


