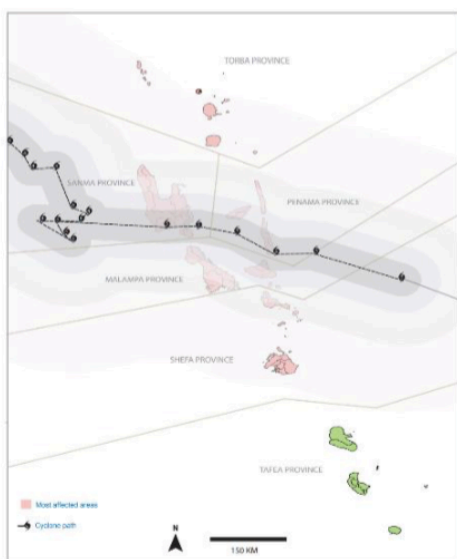


A huge thank you to all the donators who already contributed to the fundraising to assist the cocoa producers we are working with in Malo and the women groups Nok Klab located on Central Pentecost.



Following the assessment from the National Disaster Management Office Malo and Pentecost islands were highly affected by the path of the TC Harold Category 5.

From the aerial photograph 159,479 people were affected by the cyclone, which represents slightly more than 55% of the national population.

For our cocoa producers living on Malo island, where the eye of the cyclone went through 53 households were badly affected with two women who lost their lives looking for a proper place during the cyclone, livestock losses, houses destroyed and their cocoa post-harvested facilities destroyed.

The first tranche of USD 505 (58,276 VT) reached our account on the 28th of April.

With funds received from Global Giving and from other people from New Caledonia, Australia and France we organized the following shipments:

1st Shipment – 27th April 2020

Awaiting the funds to reach our account and due to the urgency of assistance for the women's group Nok Klab on Pentecost we have prepared a selection of the following materials following their request:

- First aid kit (medicine and bandage (Value 4 780 + 8 530 VT)
- 10 PVC mats (Value 6 500 VT)
- 4 baby to born clothing set (value 8 320 VT)
- mix if seeds (value 5,000 VT)
- 15 bush knives (Value 8 850 VT)
- 20 solar lamps (Value 18 000 VT)
- 7 cooking pot of 30 cms (Value 23 030 VT)
- 30 kg of Aelan chocolate (value 54 000 VT)
- second hand clothes and calico.

Total shipment value with shipment cost: 141,510 VT (approx. USD 1.226)

The shipment was sent Monday 27th April 2020 with Tevanu from Port Vila.

The parcels arrived in Melsisi on Wednesday 29th April and Aline Tarilas the president of the Nok Klab association started to distribute the goods ordered by the women and the chocolate.





2nd shipment –Thursday 30th April 2020

The second shipment was sent on Thursday 30th April with Air Vanuatu for the cocoa producers of Malo. We donated 30 kg of chocolate (120 packs of 250 g) from our company Aelan Chocolate Makers. Moli is the lead farmer for this island and it was decided that we will support them by giving them back some chocolate made with their cocoa beans! They can see the fruit of their hard work helping them now!

We also send him 100,000 vatu (approx.. USD 867) in cash to help him purchase equipment from Santo where he can find building materials cheaper than in Port Vila and could also access the materials quicker.

He purchased some basic goods with a pair of essential flip flops! And a hammer with some nails to start repair on the Malo island.

He then proudly organized the distribution back to the island of the Malo chocolate and gave back smile on the face of the community.





3rd Shipment- Monday 4th May 2020

The second shipment for Pentecost was sent Monday 4th May with the Tevanu.

The following items requested by the women from the Nok Klab were sent:

- 20 mats (value 13,000 VT)
- fabric for skirts and elastic (value 4,110 VT)
- 20 towels (Value 2,000 VT)
- various adult and children clothes (value 13,500 VT)
- seeds (value 2,440 VT)
- 1 box of Milo and powder milk (1,200 VT)

- 48 solar lamps (32,640 VT)
- second hand clothes for babies (0-2 years)

Total shipment: value with shipment cost: 70,890 VT (approx.. USD 614)

The shipment should arrive soon to Pentecost and we will organize another shipment next week.



What is planned next?

The roof of the workshop of the women of Nok Klab with the women market house were destroyed by the cyclone Harold.



We asked for quotes for the building materials and we will need approx.. **USD 9,500** to assist them building again the roof of the women workshop and the women market house. Those two structures are essential for the women as they are the community places for the community activities and the market

house is where the women are selling their gardens production and food for the community allowing the to generate some income to pay for school fees, health expenses and basic needs.
