COPE WITH COVID 19



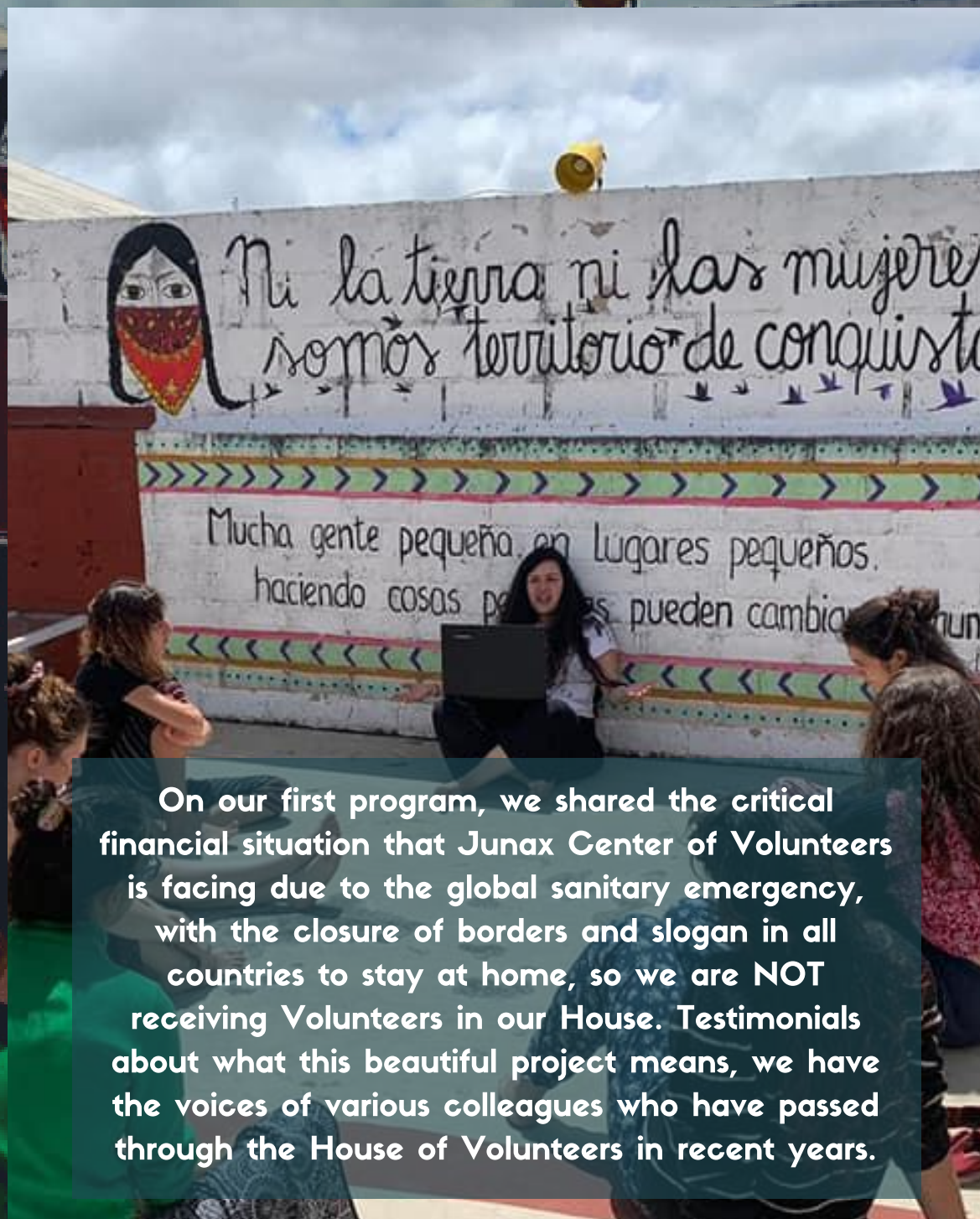


Since April, with the arrival of Covid-19 we had to make adjustments to a great part of the radio program "Oye Compa", reduced by the Junax Center of Volunteers. We could no longer transmit from the radio studio, because of the sanitary emergency, so we created and maintained a new format: sending podcasts directly from the Volunteer House.

The main objective of podcasts or micro-programs is to keep our national and international voluntary audience informed that they accompany indigenous communities. in relation to how Covid-19 affects the population of Chiapas, and continue to attend to what happens with the "Other Pandemic."

What are we talking about when we refer to the "Other Pandemic"? We talk about all violations of human rights by plagues such as poverty, inability to access health or education, unemployment, inability to make a proper living, machist violence against women and members of the LGBTQI community, forced displacement of indigenous communities in the state of Chiapas, violence against defenders of territory, etc.


The realization of the radio program has required great effort from all of us, but we are convinced that maintaining this means of communication, especially in these times of confinement, is essential in order to keep the Junax Project alive, so we can keep accompanying all communities.



On our first program, we shared the critical financial situation that Junax Center of Volunteers is facing due to the global sanitary emergency, with the closure of borders and slogan in all countries to stay at home, so we are NOT receiving Volunteers in our House. 
