Background Description:

Overview: Many Pupils, by the time they get to final Grade, have fallen greatly behind in reading; however, several of them could have received reading assistance from Children Early Reading Empowerment (CERE), in first instance allowing them to get on the right track early on. It has to be done that early: after the age of six reading problems become harder to cure with every passing year and it has to be that intensive. There is a growing need to assist struggling readers in Basic Primary Schools and before their frustration with reading becomes intensified. This proposal addresses the need for financial support for Children Early Reading Empowerment (CERE) tutors to conduct reading lessons. In addition, it addresses how this programme will benefit struggling readers by getting them close to grade-level using reading recovery methods.

Main Activities: We work to give children the education what they need to fight the inequalities that stand in their way. We believe in the power of education to help end poverty. We partner with rural communities where children often complete school without vital basic skills. Our unique approach then assist children to create sustainable and effective out of schools learning skills to further enhance their lives.

Main Objectives: This Children Early Reading Empowerment (CERE) project is significant as it will help 500 struggling readers in selected Basic Primary Schools in Madina Community in the Greater Accra Region of Ghana, to acquire reading skills that will allow them to reach the appropriate reading level. By assisting our struggling readers it would not only benefit them, but would make an impact at the local and national levels as the Pupils will utilized their skills all throughout their lives in almost all they do. It is intended to better the lives of the children participating, creating a path to a better life and a way out of poverty through being a fluent reader and writer. Being a reader and writer will open many more doors in life than if a person was not able to read or write at an appropriate level. At this point in time it is necessary to gather more data pertaining to the positive impact of (CERE) on struggling readers. This study will continue to assess how great of an impact (CERE) has on the individual Pupils

from the selected Basic Schools that participate in the program in order to in other to advance to other Communities in the near future. The main objective of the programme is to accelerate learning so that Basic School Pupils succeed before they enter a cycle of failure. Pupils that participate in the programme will be close to grade-level as a result of the programme.

Project Objectives: Are Basic School Pupils participating in the CERE programme will demonstrate effective reading strategies in order to make progress in regards to reading levels. CERE tutors will compile data pertaining to Pupils that are participating in CERE program. CERE tutors will identify the benefits of CERE tutoring through looking at assessments from the beginning and ending of the CERE tutoring sessions as well as from filling out the Tutor Survey. CERE tutors will identify Basic School Pupils that is below grade-level, in regard to reading and will develop individualized lessons for the Basic School Pupils.

Project Goals: Are to help struggling Basic Primary Pupils read at their appropriate grade level by the end of the project. And also to collect data from the tutoring lessons on the Children Early Reading Empowerment (CERE) programme to determine its effectiveness on reading performances of Pupils.

Refresher session to prepare (CERE) tutors for beginning CERE lessons and to Assess Pupils who will participate in CERE Programme

August 2020

Select Pupils to participate in the (CERE) programme, beginning with the Known and then moving into regular lessons.

October 2020	Releasing the Pupils from the programme and complete the assessments that were administered in July to determine additional progress that has been made.
November 2020	The Programme Coordinator will evaluate assessment scores, assess project goals and outcomes, and write a final report.
December 2020	The Programme Coordinator will prepare a presentation to disseminate Data collected and report and will present the data Executive Director of Gate of Hope Foundation.

When thinking of literacy and the role it plays in our daily lives, it appears to be an essential component in being able to function and communicate in society. By tutoring these Pupils before they reach Basic School completion age, there is a greater chance that they will be able to catch up to their peers. Initially, it will mainly impact the students in the CERE programme. However it may also positively impact the classroom as a whole. As a result of reading interventions and anticipated improvements to the students' reading skills and levels, the teacher will be able to instruct the class as a whole on the same level. Upon graduation and becoming adults, these Pupils will be more capable of integrating into society, becoming contributing members that are able to communicate effectively.
