Actions of CDLA facing the problem of Childhood Cancer in Mexico



One of the first factors that influence the low rate of survival of children and youth who suffer from cancer is the late detection of disease and misdiagnoses.

Those who do not start oncological

treatment at it initial stage of the

disease have minors chances of

survival. The delay time in the attention of the illness is 3 to 4 weeks.

Boost the TIMELY DETECTION of childhood and youth cancer



Promote the access to ONCOLOGIST TREATMENTS in a timely form and immediate to children and young people for early care





25% of children die during the initial stage of the oncological treatment, due to infections that can be treated.


