n the beginning of 2019, together with Yelena Kogay, my coach, have set ambitious goals – to choose a profession for further application to college and also to get me ready for independent life in the Youth House. I was graduating the 9th grade and couldn't decide whether to choose a profession of cook or designer. Yelena helped me to make up my mind, to understand what my strong features are, to understand what I want. She was telling me about other professions and we were looking at many options. As a result, I decided to apply to the architectural college.

Moreover, Lena helped me to get ready for the transfer from the orphanage to the Youth House. For many kids this is a very emotional and distressing moment: if previously we used to be completely taken care of by the staff of an orphanage, then upon graduation one should rely mainly on oneself. Lena taught me how to cook simple dishes, how to spend

money and how to distribute my scholarship.

At first glance, this might seem minuscular but it was a real life saving for me. I was greatly concerned that I won't be admitted to college, won't be able to deal with an adult independent life in the Youth House. But thanks to Lena, who kept cheering me up, I learnt how to trust in myself.

Now I'm a 1st year student. I'm happy that everything worked out fine and grateful to Lena. I know that I can approach her for support, advice and help with personal issues at any moment and she is always there for me. Although I don't have a mentor or older comrade, Lena became my friend and a very close person. We keep working together and are now setting goals for 2020 which I'm sure I will be able to achieve with the help of my coach.
