ENGAGE. To invest in CKA is to believe in the potential of the Korean American community. We champion our members as agents of change and connectivity. To engage our membership and turn potential into action, we need to provide avenues through which we can connect and mobilize. Our Engage initiative is designed to address these needs in the following ways:



EXPANSION OF DIGITAL COMMUNITY PLATFORM FOR MEMBERS

In 2019, CKA launched a digital community platform called Hivebrite to provide its members and stakeholders a space to 1) allow communication with each other through a common channel, 2) hold community forums to discuss complex issues and poll public opinion, and 3) build a sense of shared community within CKA.

This Engage initiative gives our members a powerful tool to connect with each other; to organize via location, sector, or shared interest; and to contribute and interact with content within the CKA community.

Sponsorship Available

Sponsorship will cover the maintenance, subscription, expansion, and staff training required to manage the Hivebrite platform.

LAUNCH ADDITIONAL IMPACT TASK FORCES (ITF)

To tap into the leadership potential of CKA's growing membership, CKA launched its first Impact Task Force (ITF) in 2019. These volunteer ITFs are composed of passionate members who aim to achieve specific purposes and program goals. Each of these ITF's can apply for an action grant through CKA to finance the work towards one impact goal that they wish to fulfill.

In 2019, the Women's Leadership ITF has hosted several convenings across NY and DC for the purpose of empowering Asian American Women leaders. This year, we are launching additional ITFs with the mission of helping more Korean Americans enter public boards and empower regional nonprofit leaders for greater impact in their communities.

Sponsorship Available

LAUNCH KOREAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY

Government, nonprofits, and corporations alike all rely on quantitative and qualitative data to decide where to allocate grants and resources, build offices and stores, and even redistrict voting areas. Although the U.S. Census and other national surveys have made great strides in partially capturing demographic, social, economic and political information on the Korean American community, currently there is no comprehensive and national data report focused solely on the Korean American community.

In partnership with UC Berkeley political scientist and leading public opinion expert, Dr. Taeku Lee, CKA will launch a national survey project on the current state of Korean Americans across the United States. This project will examine Korean American views and experiences on important issues, such as political and socio-economic issues, civic engagement, mental health, and youth challenges.

Sponsorship Available

eNLIGHTEN

Amplifying Korean American voices through
online communication platforms

ENLIGHTEN. To promote CKA's mission and the voice of the Korean American community, CKA has invested in new media channels to connect with and educate the broader public. In 2019, we launched two communications initiatives: a new podcast and a completely revamped website. This year, we plan to launch an e-learning initiative to host online workshops and seminars, as well as continue with the second season of our successful podcast.

SPONSOR A SEASON OF KOREAN AMERICAN PERSPECTIVES PODCAST

In 2019, CKA launched our first podcast, Korean American Perspectives, to explore complex issues that shape the Korean American community and showcase the life stories of Korean American leaders, trailblazers, and pioneers. The podcast is now available on iTunes, Spotify, Podbean, and other platforms.

This year, we aim to launch a second season with new Korean American leaders, covering the topics of identity, mental health, mindfulness, and other issues of interest within the Korean American community.

ELEVATE. At CKA, we believe in the importance of lifelong education and growth. We strive to provide opportunities for our community's leaders to sharpen their technical skills. Throughout the year and around the country, CKA hosts trainings to cultivate tactical and soft skill sets that are essential for effective management, networking, and communication.

PROFESSIONAL TRAINING AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Our Elevate trainings focus on practical leadership development, ranging from public speaking to media training to fundraising. CKA's inaugural Elevate Training was held in partnership with the Asian American Journalists Association (AAJA) on April 13, 2019, at Columbia University. Attendees received training from veteran journalists on how to publish op-eds and prepare for on-camera interviews. The second elevate training was held in partnership with StoryBrand on June 2, 2019, at Loyola Marymount University. Attendees were led through a critical process from crafting one's narrative to identifying one's main audience.
