Uweza recognizes that Kibera residents are creative, resilient and resourceful and that sustainable change requires a future generation that is more educated, motivated and empowered. Founded in 2008, today they provide 300 Kenyan children and youth with unique opportunities to pursue a path to a better future through the discovery and development of their talents and abilities – gaining education and ultimately earning incomes that utilize their own inherent strengths.

Uweza seeks and nurtures long-term relationships with individual children and youth to have a more lasting and impactful effect, versus a short-term emergency response to young peoples' needs. All 12 staff members live in Kibera and know the community well. Uweza has developed its programs in response to needs expressed by Kibera community members.

Uweza currently has 6 programs

Art Gallery - provides youth artists with space and materials to create and market their own original art, which is sold <u>online</u>, at the gallery and through events and exhibitions.

Bright Futures - an empowerment program and support group for young mothers ages 18 to 30

Community Centre - The space provides Kibera residents, especially youth, a safe place to exchange ideas, explore talents and interests, learn new skills, and develop holistically.

Golden Girls Power - provides safe space for adolescent girls from Kibera to meet, form friendships, learn life skills, and discuss issues that are important to them.

Soccer Academy - provides both boys and girls from the Kibera slum the opportunity to participate in coached training sessions as well as matches and tournaments

Sponsorship Program - links sponsors to children in Kibera in order to provide academic scholarships for bright children in need of support

#### Support Required:

The Turning Point Trust is a Christian charity that exists to empower the vulnerable children and families of Kibera by creating opportunities for them to reach their full God-given potential. TP Trust's work is holistic in that they aim to see the people they serve develop physically, socially and spiritually. The organisation values relationships because so much positive change can occur through strong, caring relationships. They point people to Jesus and allow Him to give them hope as they give him glory with their fullest potential.

This is achieved through four areas of work:

**School Transition:** Children's Centre with Prep Class for children who have never been to school and need to learn the basics before joining Primary School and Transition Class for children who have been in school and dropped out. In Transition Class, children catch up on the schooling they've missed so that they can re-join formal education where they left off. There is an element of rehabilitation in this project as many of the children have become accustomed to life on the streets. **Fountains of Hope School:** this primary school focuses on quality and aims to develop the whole child. Each class has no more than 25 pupils, classrooms are spacious and bright with enough textbooks and learning materials for all. Pupils enjoy a free feeding programme so they can concentrate in class. Children study the national curriculum and take extra classes in discipleship, I.T., sports and creative arts.

**Community Library:** a quiet well-lit space packed full of books and learning resources for children and families in the community to use. Children come every evening to do homework, read their favourite stories and read more about snakes, aeroplanes, ballet dancers or any topic that interests them. The space is also used for spelling competitions and holiday art workshops. **School Support:** supporting children to attend secondary schools and vocational training.



Location: Kibera

## Support Required:

- Funds for food vouchers for families 500ksh per family per week (targeting 150 families)
- Funds for water and soap for handwashing stations 1,000Ksh per station per week
- 5litre bottles of liquid soap
- Funds for mask production 50Ksh for mask production paying mothers of the school's students who have been trained in tailoring (targeting 750 masks for Phase 1)
- Donations of material for masks e.g. tshirts (especially kids tshirts with fun designs for kid-sized masks), kitenge, etc

• Sewing face masks

## Prayer Requests:

- Pray for the 177 kids who normally attend their education programmes for their health, safety and ongoing learning.
- Pray as their social workers use their scorecard survey to identify the most vulnerable families so they can target our support.

Gifted Community Centre GCC is a registered, independent, disability and development youth led (community based) organization formed for and by youth with disabilities in Kibera. GCC majorly targets youth/ persons with disabilities residing within the informal settlements of Nairobi, especially Kibera, and college/ university youth with disabilities.

The collective focus of Gifted Community Centre GCC and its members and partners is on achieving the following:

- To support persons with disabilities in sustainable livelihoods through capacity building training, business startups, and direct employment.
- To improve the skills, knowledge, and experiences of youth with disabilities through multifaceted approaches.
- To improve the literacy levels and rates of children and adults with disabilities.
- To assist and support individual talents, and enhance personal employability programmes.

## PROGRAMS

Advocate and Outreach: hold very active Weekly Live Twitter Chats, and other off and online campaigns with persons with disabilities as the main lead.

**Empower and Employability:** strive to close the unemployment gap by providing youth with disabilities with skills that match the job market through partnerships, civic education and other multifaceted approaches, to support them to either acquire a job or startup their own business.

**Educate and Inform:** Lack of education and access to opportunities has denied persons with disabilities a chance to enjoy their rights, and utilize the available opportunities. GCC closes this gap by keeping girls with intellectual and other severe disabilities in schools by providing training and reusable sanitary pads. **Leadership and Mentorship:** unleashing the full potential of youth with disabilities, where we attach them with a mentor of their choice online/ physical for personal and professional growth.

The current infant mortality rate in Kenya is 39 out of every 1,000 live births. 17 mothers die every day during childbirth. Toto Care Box Africa Trust is working to reduce these rates by promoting antenatal care for mothers in disadvantaged areas. Mums-to-be are encouraged to attend 4 antenatal classes and check-ups with the incentive of receiving a Toto Care Box when they deliver their baby at a health facility. These boxes are designed to provide a safe sleeping space for infants and contain a mattress, bedding and mosquito net as well as life-saving items such as WaterGuard, cream for umbilical cord care and handwashing soap. Each box costs 3,000ksh.

To date, over 1,600 boxes have been distributed.

Through a partnership with Lengo Medical Clinic in Mukuru, Toto Care Box created a criteria for expectant women to qualify to receive a life-saving box for their newborn. The mothers-to-be have to attend at least 4 antenatal care visits and deliver in the health facility.

During the visits, they receive information on key messages on newborn care, breastfeeding, family planning, birth preparedness and labor & delivery. Through this programme, antenatal care uptake has increased by 124% and health facility delivery by 58% since Toto Care Box began the baby box program in April 2017.



Location: Mukuru

#### Activities:

• Continuing with the normal programme to distribute boxes and provide training which includes hygiene measures. Demand is increasing.

#### Support Required:

- Funds to provide Toto Care Boxes with Soap and Water Purifier to mothers of newborns in Mukuru. Each box costs 3,000ksh
- Items for the boxes cotton wool, lesos, water guard, handwashing soap, newborn baby clothes, reusable nappies

Billian Music Family resource & leadership centre is a non- profit-making organization located at Mama Africa building adjacent to Kiboro Primary school grounds in Mathare community. Its core purpose is to transform the lives and livelihoods of children and young people by providing a safe environment & space that nurtures young talents & leaders and giving back to the Mathare community through music, education, dance and other social and developmental activities.

The work of Billian Music Family covers several programmes including:

**Day Care and Activities for Children with Disability:** They take care of the children from the community living with disabilities by providing them with a safe space, meals and free physiotherapy sessions at the centre twice a week. The therapy is done in partnership with the Action Foundation Kenya.

**Leadership and Mentorship:** Through a Teens Leadership Programme BMF partners with secondary schools in Mathare community enlightening students about their rights and introduce them to the day today nationwide current affairs such as politics in order to air their views and contributions without fear of discrimination or elimination. Through this programme they identify students with leadership traits and enrol them in mentorship programmes during school holiday. An Influencers Leadership Programme supports and empowers existing changemakers in the community with leadership skills.

**Library**: A safe space with revision books whereby pupils study and are guided through their homework after school.

**Arts Activities:** The team assists various individuals to venture into art activities which act as a source of income to many unemployed youths and mothers.

**Skills Training:** Young people, especially the mothers of children with disabilities, are trained in skills such as mobile phone repairs in order for them to earn money to support their families.

Scholarships: Keeping children in education by giving them scholarships

Garden of Hope Foundation is a Nonprofit organization that is passionate about restoring hope to underserved youth, children, women and girls from urban slums and rural communities. The organisation's mission is to create sustainable social and economic opportunities for youth, women and children in urban slums and rural communities. This is done through four areas of work:

**Mentorship:** Equipping high students with tools and skills that support them to deal with social and health challenges they face such as substance abuse, teenage pregnancies, sexual reproductive health. It also supports high school students to make informed decisions. This is all accomplished through interactive sessions, peer education training, peer to peer mentorship, group mentorship, debates and counseling.

**Leadership Development and Entrepreneurship:** Providing sustainable solutions to youths living in the marginalized Kibera slum. This program is guided by three core objectives:

- 1. To ensure disadvantaged youth in Kibera acquire life skills, relevant labor market skills and skills in small business development.
- 2. To facilitate disadvantaged youth access to job opportunities through private & public partnerships.
- 3. To ensure youth receive mentorship as they transition to work and school (College and University).

**Internship and Volunteer Opportunities:** Building professional competency in community development among youth in urban slums and rural communities through creating volunteer and internship opportunities. Also supporting university students from local and International universities to gain experience by offering academic attachment opportunities.

**Water Sanitation Hygiene:** Building the capacity of marginalized communities and changing the behavior around the challenging issues of hygiene and sanitation using interactive Art. The programme provides



integrated WASH services with the goal of preventing contamination caused by unhygienic latrines, contaminated water and unsafe hygienic practices through blending fun with education.

The Action Foundation (TAF) is an award winning Non Governmental Organization working to build inclusive and resilient communities where children and young people with disabilities can thrive. Children with disabilities are among the country's most vulnerable group due to stigma, discrimination, poor parent-child interactions, institutionalization and lack of support. They are often perceived as less valuable than other children and are more likely to experience violence in their lifetime.

The Action Foundation has 4 programmes.

**Tunza - Health and Well-being:** Improving the health and nutrition outcomes of children with disabilities and their families. This is done through Intervention Services (Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Medical Assessment, Medical Referrals, Provision of mobility and assistive devices), Nutrition support and counseling, Parent engagement and capacity building, Psychosocial support.

**Somesha** - **Inclusive Education:** Supporting children with disabilities to access quality and inclusive education from their early years to the highest level possible. This involves Teacher preparedness through training and coaching, Educational Assessments and tailored learning support, Promoting Digital learning through mobile and web-based platforms, Peer to peer support through The Action Foundation's Children Dialogue Book on Inclusion, Promoting inclusion through Arts Based Learning.

**Ibuka - Women and Girl Empowerment:** Enhancing livelihoods, resilience and dignity for women and girls with disabilities. This programme provides Entrepreneurship and Economic Development, Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights Education, Distribution of dignity kits, Mentorship and Leadership Training, Career preparedness workshops, Gender Based Violence Prevention, Psychosocial support and referral to legal and protection services.

**Child Protection & Safeguarding:** Children with disabilities are highly vulnerable to violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect. TAF partners and builds the capacity of caregivers, teachers and community at large in promoting the rights of the children and ensuring they are protected.
