PROFILE:

KADO is a National Membership Organization initiated in 1998 to respond to limited health services and extensive poverty of the people of Kagumu Sub-county in Kibuku district Uganda, registered in 1999 as a Community Based Organization (CBO) and as an NGO in 2004. KADO currently operates in Eastern, northern, Central and west Nile regions of Uganda. Its head office is in Kibuku District in Eastern Uganda. KADO has a branch office in Dokolo District in Northern Uganda, Luwero District in central Uganda and Arua District in west Nile Region.

KADO works with most vulnerable communities living in extreme poverty, reaching thousands of family members in 32 districts of Uganda. With primary funding from sponsors and government, corporate and individual donors, we work long-term in communities to help them transform themselves into places where children, youth and women lack what they need to live at their potential throughout their lives: access to health care, nutrition, food security, household incomes and learning opportunities.

MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNANCE:

MEMBERSHIP: The organization is governed by a board comprising of 9 members (5 male and 4 female).The executive director is appointed to the board as secretary to the board and being responsible for the secretariat and day-to-day management of the affairs of the organization
Membership: Individual and group membership is open however, one can be a member after paying membership fee which is determined by the general assembly.



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1. HEALTH CARE SERVICE DELIVERY.

The organization runs a health center which provides:

1. Comprehensive health services ranging from OPD, IPD, antenatal, immunization, dental, eye care testing of HIV/AIDS.
2. Trains local communities on prevention and management strategies of HIV/AIDS and TB, Malaria and other communicable diseases.
3. Provide refresher training to community linkage facilitator / VHTS and health workers on integrated community case management of Malaria, pneumonia, diarrhea in west Nile region and Luwero District.
4. Distributes long lasting insecticide treated nets to pregnant mothers and children less than five years

FOOD SECURITY AND NUTRITION:

Food security- i.e. having sufficient nutritious food at all times that meets the food requirements of the Household. KADO support the most affected OVC and the child headed households and children from very poor households due to the increase in the poverty levels in the community by:
