THE HUMBLE BEGINNINGS OF ODESSA IN SHSC

I applied for whatever position was open at that time in Sacred Heart Savings Cooperative (SHSC). Fortunately, they were looking for a Youth Coordinator for the newly organized Laboratory Cooperative of SHSC. During my application, I was interviewed by Mr. Rey F. Tanglib, the Human Resource Manager, through the approval of then CEO Mr. Jaime "Jim" D. Gaboy Jr.





I was then officially hired by SHSC on July 1, 2014. The main program that I was assigned to handle was the Aflatoun Program. I must say that the trust and belief that Sir Jim had given me lit the fire in my heart and soul. Sir Jim was a believer that the Aflatoun Program can help a lot of children. He gave me his wholehearted support, which also gave me the confidence to perform the work, even if I was not yet familiar with the Program.

Right after I was hired, the Aflatoun Trainers' Training was organized by NATCCO last July 2014. From the first training until now, each day is a full-packed, busy day with Aflatoun. I hope Sir Jim is happy with what we have done in the Aflatoun Program—that we have reached the fruits of his vision, although it is sad that he is no longer with us. But his legacy will live on forever in every child that we educate each day.

DEALING WITH CHALLENGES IN THE AFLATOUN PORGRAM

Challenges are part of the deal and they are inevitable considering the partner schools that we have. But in a way, the challenges also push us to revisit our procedures and make improvements. Way back 2014, dealing with a new program (Aflatoun) as a newly hired employee is very thought-provoking, to list some – What is this program all about? How is this being implemented and part of the Laboratory Cooperative?

For the past eight years of working as a Program Officer, some challenges revolve around program logistics like updating passbooks - just imagine updating 18,000 passbooks! Thus, we decided to do the updating on a weekly basis and we now allot five to six days before the passbooks are returned to the pupils. We cannot impose on the branches to expedite the updating of the passbooks because the branches also serve thousands of regular members.

Another challenge is the presence or absence of the savings collector. Apart from the Aflatoun Program, the collectors also serve and visit regular Co-op members and sometimes applied for a leave of absence due to sickness or personal activities.

Hence, there are times when the teachers complain that the collectors did not visit them during Savings Day.

Although the collectors' absence is not a regular recurrence, we try to make up for it by sending a collector after Savings Day or within the week.

With the teachers, the challenge is that a lot of them are asking for incentives. We provide incentives as much as we can through classroom or school improvement and gifts during Aflatoun activities involving teachers. We also plan to make a more institutionalized incentive system for the schools and the teachers.

As to the parents, they usually complain about the awards for the kids. Some parents are really into the "medals and gifts" as measurements of achievement. We always emphasize that it is not about the amount of savings but the consistency of savings. Thus, we look into the average daily balance and the regular deposit of savings.

Personally, I am also challenged by having to talk with the Schools Division Offices, especially those who are not yet familiar with the Aflatoun Program. Some of them see the Program as an additional task for the teachers and additional expenses for the parents.

Also, since the program involves a voluntary savings component, the Division Office does not like the idea of monetary transactions. To face a challenge like this, I provide them with the success stories of the other Divisions as testimonies.



These stories make the Division office realize that the Program is doable and sustained. But can Superintendent still refuses to implement the Program, we do not insist and do not push too much. We would just hope that soon they can see and appreciate the benefits of the Aflatoun to the students. Hopefully, they would be the ones to approach us, and this had happened already, that a Division Office was the one that approached us instead of us reaching out to them. We count our blessings.

Since I am the only one doing full-time work for SHSC's Lab Coop, organizing Aflatoun activities is also very challenging and it is difficult for me to visit and monitor all the Divisions. Thus, it is necessary that each branch has full ownership of the Program and does everything it can for its success. Being with the Program, sometimes you have to sacrifice your personal interest just to fit into our stakeholders' schedules.


