Since inception in 2014, we have hosted a number of events and workshops ranging from summer bootcamps to science competitions and have impacted the lives of over 650 girls and young women.

STEM at Home kit

We are pleased to introduce our first product recently launched in September, a STEM @ Home kit designed with kids (age 10+) who love Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) and experimenting with things they find around them. The kit contains two experiments, materials required, the STEM learning briefs and a step-by-step guide. Through the kits, the kids get the opportunity to learn how to make **their own lip balm** and build a robotic **prosthetic arm**.

This product aims to help kids learn at home without any boundaries like power and internet access, especially with recent adaptation to hybrid/remote learning. With these activities, the kids will be able to learn basic STEM principles like chemical reactions and prosthesis through hands-on, fun and creative experiments from the comfort of their home.

It aims to provide the practical application of STEM principles in fun and exciting ways from home.
