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- What is Lights On For Children?
 - Our Sanctuary Bahamas, in partnership with Paving The Way Foundation are hosting Lights On For Children. This is an international event to celebrate World Children's Day and raise awareness about child sexual abuse and trafficking.
 - On Friday November 20th, at dusk, turn on this blue light – letting The Bahamas know that you are a light of hope in the darkness for children.
 - Let your light shine in the darkness to raise awareness about child exploitation and let children know that they are loved, they matter and we want them to be safe.
 - There are hundreds of children that are being sexually abused around the world. The median age for reported abuse is 9 years old. That is not okay with us and we're pretty sure it's not okay with you.
 - Together we can make a difference.
 - Shining your light in the darkness will have a GIANT impact for our children.
