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NEARLY 50 000 LEARNERS REACHED THROUGH THE NBCC IN 2022

EMERGINATION AFRICA IS PLEASED TO INFORM YOU THAT WE SUCCESSFULLY RAN THE NATIONAL BUSINESS CASE COMPETITION FOR 2022.

This year's program impacted nearly 50 000 learners from across Zimbabwe. The NBCC program successfully onboarded 140

High schools from across all the 10 provinces of Zimbabwe. The program was deliberate in inclusivity with a gender parity of, 10 girls', 15 boys' and 115 mixed gender schools. Attention was also given to bring socio-economic status with inclusion, as such 87 government schools, 45 mission schools and 8 private schools participated in the competition. The target profile of beneficiaries within each of the aforementioned provinces were, High school learners between the ages of 16 and 18 both male and female. This was done to create and allow for interdisciplinary action among the students

- ✓ . The largest portion of teachers were those teaching Commercial subjects Studies, however it was open to all teachers that teach the various subjects that fall within the Zimbabwean Curriculum.

✓ The program came to a climatic end with the top 30 teams presenting at the Harare NBCC Finals in front of a high-level panel of investors. The national finals produced 5 teams which were selected by the panel of investors to transition into the Virtual Innovation Accelerator.

✓ The Virtual Innovation Accelerator is an opportunity for Emergination Africa to accelerate National Business Case Competitions student entrepreneurs in Zimbabwe to create economic opportunities in their communities through innovative ventures aligned to the SDGs. The top 5 ideas received seed capital of \$ 5000 investment and prize money. This is an opportunity for the ventures to continue working on their solutions alongside their teacher coaches.

MEET THE MARKETING TEAMS

The five teams that are part of this year's VIA cohort are

1. Marist Nyanga - (Manicaland province) with a pig grower feed from indigenous fruits called Masekesa,
2. Milton High School- (Bulawayo province) who pitched their indigenous Fruit based cereal,
3. Westridge High School with an e-bicycle sharing platform.
4. St Dominics Chishawasha - (Mashonaland East Province) with an Agricultural foil from algae
5. Nashville High School – (Midlands Province) with a Rabbit Urine as fertilizer.
