## Our Fight

Congenital heart disease (CHD) is the most common birth defect globally. low-to-middle income Asian countries are registering the highest incidence of Cardiac cases. Every year, 60,000 babies are born with varying severity of CHD in Pakistan. Unfortunately in Pakistan, we have only three Pediatric Intensive Care Units (PICU) fully dedicated to child Cardiac Surgery patients.

Every month, Transparent Hands receive multiple cases that require surgeries or medical treatments. A large majority of these medical cases come from rural, underdeveloped areas of Pakistan where there are neither any proper medical institutes nor any expert surgeons. At Transparent Hands, we have done our best to facilitate such cases and save lives.

### Ayesha Hameed's Story



Ayesha Hameed, 3.4 years old, was diagnosed with Dextrocardia and partial atrioventricular canal (PAVC) defect in her heart. She was admitted in the hospital and her open heart Surgery was performed on 25-09-2020 by Dr. Mohammad Asim Khan at Ittefaq Hospital, Lahore.

Her Atrial switch procedure was done. Her hospital stay was six days and then she was discharged in a stable condition. With your support, Ayesha Hameed is on the road to recovery.

### **Rimsha Farman's Story**



9-year-old Rimsha Farman was diagnosed with a ventricular septal defect in her heart. The doctor advised an open heart Surgery (VSD closure) for her. She was admitted in University of Lahore Teaching Hospital and the Surgery was performed by Dr. Salman Ahmed on 24.08.2020. The septal defect in her heart was repaired successfully. Rimsha stayed in the hospital for four days and was discharged in a stable condition. Her health is improving and she is right on her way to a complete recovery.

## Muhammad Faheem's Story



Muhammad Faheem, 2 years old, was experiencing dyspnoea on exertion since birth. He was diagnosed with ventricular septal defect (VSD) and was advised to open-heart surgery to close it. His surgery was done at Ittefaq Hospital through Pakistan Children Heart Foundation, on 15-01-20, by Dr. Asim Khan. He had good post-op recovery in ICU and ward care for 5 days. He was discharged with stable vitals and in a satisfactory condition.
