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Project Progress

One of the major strategies we have been using is giving out hard-copy reading materials to our little libraries. By far, 500 books have been donated making it successful till now. This has been seen through massive participation from the public showing an increase in literacy rates. However, by this year over 700 kids had taken loaned out books as an indication that there was still hope for enhancing their reading habits in order to elevate the level of literacy in future.

1 Donating Physical Books

One of our key strategies has been the donation of physical books to regional libraries. This year, we reached a significant milestone by donating 500 hard-copy reading materials, igniting a renewed passion for reading among the youth. The impact of this effort is reflected in the enthusiastic participation from the community, with over 800 children borrowing books. This indicates a promising trend towards cultivating lifelong reading habits, crucial for elevating literacy levels in the future

2 Digital Books Access through Moodlebox

Recognizing the importance of technology in education, we launched the Moodlebox Project to extend our reach into the hinterlands. This innovative platform allowed us to deliver e-books alongside physical volumes, making stories accessible to children regardless of their geographical location. By collaborating with Africanstory, a free site offering a diverse array of digital stories, we provided Kanvilli Nuriya Primary School with a rich collection of e-books. Our donated Moodlebox devices and tablets have become a cornerstone for learning, enabling students to explore new worlds and ideas.

3 Ofline Access to Educational Resources

One of the standout features of the Moodlebox Project is its ability to function offline, crucial for areas with limited or no internet connectivity. At Kanvilli Nuriya Primary School, students now have access to an extensive library of digital books on their Moodlebox devices and tablets. This resource has not only fostered a vibrant reading culture but also enhanced the learning process, equipping students with the tools needed to succeed in an increasingly digital world.
