It is committed to providing family services, social services, and women's economic empowerment programs, which enable families to overcome poverty, adapt means of sustainable development, and empower women to improve their livelihood. DWN has been building collaborations with various non- governmental organizations to further its goals and is planning on applying its extensive experience to assist internally displaced and vulnerable families in Darfur, as well as other regions in Sudan.

Our mission: to work to empower displaced women and vulnerable families to build peaceful and sustainable livelihood through economic, social change, and resiliency.

Our vision: prosperous integrated communities where every citizen enjoys a dignified living in Sudan.

Our strategy is to identify and to meet immediate needs of the community by providing vital services to empower women to build new skills, gain knowledge, and get access to financial resources to create lasting change.

The Darfur Women Network is registered in Sudan and opened an office in South Darfur State in 2021.

Darfur Women Network launched its first project in August 2021, in Nyala.

Sustainable Development program, Capacity Building, and Job Opportunities- Economic Empowerment for women from displaced, vulnerable, and poor families in Nyala, South Darfur State.

A project is Soap Making Training- Liquid, Bar Soap, and Detergent

Our participants were 30 displaced women from four camps: Sakali, Mousi, Al-Wali, and Sharg-Al Fania.



DWN is a soap making incubator to ensure the availability of production, resources, and positive impacts of the project.

We conducted three soap making workshops for 35 women from displaced, vulnerable, and poor families. They trained on making high quality liquid, detergent, and bar soap.











The goals of this project :

- 1- Providing training and capacity building for women to ensure making high quality soap
- 2- Ensure technical and financial support to enable women to earn steady income
- 3- Produce hygiene items for reasonable price
- 4- Build strong foundation for societal peaceful living
- 5- Secure training, fund, and job opportunities
- 6- Reduce numbers of child laborers and dropped outs.
- 7- Building informational systems to enable organizations to meet the needs

Operation- Soap making production

The women are now ready for production. Some of them are making liquid soap, some are making bar soap, and some are making detergent. The marketing team

sells the products and searches for new customers while some collect feedback from the customers to improve their products to keep their customers and attract the potential ones.

Another group of displaced women are joining the project in October 2021.

- 1- Capacity building for women
- 2- Earning steady income
- 3- Improving economic, social, and livelihood
- 4- Raising awareness of the importance of education and support the children to achieve their academic goals
- 5- Collaborate, partner, or build coalition with different organizations to provide more service
