

Project Três

A collaboration between Kintsugi and Project Três, this project was born from the need of empowering the women of the community by using gardening as another tool.

The idea behind the project was to enable the women to be able to grow their own food which is organic and zero budget, become more self-sufficient, and to provide them with the education to become entrepreneurs in food production if they wish to be.

Out of the 15 women working with Project Três in Anjuna, 6 women's houses were chosen to design and implement small scale permaculture gardens, these six were the most excited with the idea of growing their own food, the rest of the women had little interest, or they live in the rental space and do not have the permission to make gardens.


Each of the women had different sizes of land to be worked on, the smallest patch being $1m^2$ Working on the different kinds of lands (size and topography wise) gave the women good exposure in terms of space management and soil health improvisation.

All the other women joined the training / workshops / garden building programmes at these six people's properties. They got the hands-on experience, from making their own fence to digging, to building garden beds, to harvesting rainwater to growing their own food.

The long term goal for this project will be to establish a community garden at the Project Três Centre, here in Goa.

The women will grow with the gardens in their homes and can eventually start a big garden for the Community Center.

Once they are well taught off and understand gardening, they can also start giving training programmes to more women / men from the neighbourhood on how to create gardens and live a healthy life.





MANOJ DEVI



She has a monthly salary since last year, and due to that, she was the one responsible to look after her household expenses during covid times. She proudly says "Now I know, women can do anything."


She and her elder son are fond of gardening, and hers was the first house where we made the garden. We made a raised garden bed (80 cm * 2 m) in her house.

Since she had very little soil in her house, we used a lot of dead organic matter and trained all the women in regenerating soil.























LAKSHMI

She is a mother of 2 and very sweet woman. She loves to garden and had a small garden already. She was so curious to learn how to improve her gardening skills.


It was such fun to create an extension of her tiny patch using the permaculture tools, her garden was made asymmetrical by maximizing land use and adding a small soak trench at the edge of the garden.




























Rajshree hails from Goa.

Project Tres was her first job in her life. She had a sewing machine but only had stitched things for her family and children. Her husband is a carpenter

She is always smiling and she loves the work she does, she enjoys stitching and feels very proud of seeing her products ready.

She was skeptical of us starting a project in her house, as in the beginning she did not understand what we would do to her land, but got super excited when she saw the work we did in Manoj Devi's house.

We created a keyhole inspired garden (diameter of the bed 2m) for Rajshree, which had a 30 cm deep soak trench.












RAJSHREE'S GARDEN






Sharmila is one of those very strong wonder women, she is a very dedicated and hardworking person, always curious to learn something new.

























Rupa is from Goa and works as the quality control manager for Project Tres.























Farida, one inspiring woman you meet and are thrilled by her persona. Anyone who meets Farida can not say they don't love her.



It was Harshita's quest to find peace within which lead to her leaving her career in fashion and moving to an experimental township called Auroville, where she was introduced to permaculture.


She started connecting with Mother Earth and hence becoming much more sensitive to many problems of the world. In the belief of bringing positive change in the world using permaculture and other important tools for community development, she started Kintsugi.

She has done permaculture and women empowerment projects in different countries. Having Auroville as her home base, she is a nomad who travels wherever in the world the projects take her.

Project Tres was founded in 2015 when Carla, its founder met Farida, the president of the Project in India now who was at that time barely making any money to manage her family of 5 children.

After graduating as a fashion designer, Project Três founder Carla Maria de Souza worked for more than six years in the fashion industry. As she moved up in the fashion industry she began to realize its limitations, especially those related to social and environmental sustainability. Carla gave up her stable career and while traveling on a journey towards empowerment to heal the wounds left by domestic violence experienced in her childhood, she felt a need to share her story and inspire people to overcome their struggles and traumas.

Using her skills, she wanted to transform fashion into a path of empowerment, in a sustainable, fair, and ethical way. She wanted to start a movement. Project Três was born.



Project Três provides jobs for 31 artisans in India and in Kenya, and through education and community training, has collaborated with over 100 women since the beginning of the project. We have 30 people volunteering with us, being 90% of women. We are located in 11 different cities and 7 different countries.


