Our vision:

To break the cycle of poverty and achieve the sustainable development of communities through education, uplifting human beings, and generating peace and prosperity.





The problem we solve:

According to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), it takes up to 11 generations to break the cycle of poverty in Mexico.

According to UNESCO, studies have shown that education has direct and indirect repercussions on both economic growth and poverty. Education provides skills that increase job opportunities and income while helping to protect people from socioeconomic vulnerabilities.

In February 2021, the National Council for the Evaluation of Social Development Policy (CONEVAL) estimated an increase of 8.9 and 9.8 million Mexicans with an income below the poverty line due to the Covid-19 crisis; it calculates that 70.9 million now live in poverty, 56.7% of the population.



How we solve it:

The Gibson Soto Foundation's purpose is to break the cycle of poverty and achieve sustainable development by providing bright young women students from marginalized communities the necessary means to access quality education and full development.

The Gibson Soto Foundation program was designed and planned to strategically address the different areas of development of the beneficiaries, thus meeting the objectives set and directing the actions to achieve our goals.

SUCCESS STORY: ALEJANDRA INDUSTRIAL ENGINEER



My name is Alejandra. I am a young woman from the Otomí community of Santiago Mexquititlán, Municipality of Amealco, Querétaro.

Neither of my parents finished elementary school. My father passed away, and my mother is an Otomi doll artisan. The average monthly income of my family is 4,000 pesos (USD 200). I am the first woman in my family to finish high school. Thanks to the generous donors and volunteers who support the Gibson Soto Foundation, I am now the first woman to graduate from college.

Before I came to the Gibson Soto Foundation, my life was complicated. I lived alone, felt emotionally alone, and had financial problems. I did not have enough food and very little money; I would rather save the money for the bus to school than buy other things.

The Foundation offered me the opportunity to have a roof, three meals a day, a full scholarship, and emotional, psychological, and social support.




I thank the Gibson Soto Foundation for giving me all the necessary support to continue my studies. Above all, I am grateful for the extracurricular courses and workshops they have given me to help me grow in different areas. Participating in the human development workshops has broadened my vision of myself and others; it has opened my mind to think about things I have never asked myself before.

Now, I direct my thoughts and actions to do my best, forgiving myself, forgiving others, loving myself, and loving others. I do not question the behavior of others, and I do not judge their actions. I can't always do it, but being aware makes me reflect on how we all have a reason for being, a known and unknown past, things to heal, and things to discover or learn, making human diversity beautiful.

Participating in workshops has improved my relationships with others, especially myself; I still have a lot to learn and practice, but I am ready to do it. I want to be able to feel free.

Thanks to the support of the Gibson Soto Foundation, I fulfilled my biggest dream: graduating as an Industrial Engineer in August. That same month I was hired as a Process Engineer at a company in Querétaro. I now have enough income to support myself and my family.

Thanks to all the generous hearts, the Foundation has transformed my life.

I will always be grateful for belonging here; for finding this opportunity and fulfilling my childhood dream.




Dulce





Martha Evelyn Pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Biotechnology Engineering




By the year 2030 -





