Dear KKOOM supporters,

I hope you are enjoying this beautiful spring weather! We have had an eventful spring largely in part to your wonderful support!

We are currently participating in a challenge to secure a permanent spot on <u>globalgiving.org</u>, a website that has been featured in *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post*. GlobalGiving connects individual and institutional donors directly to social, environmental, and economic development projects around the world! Since 2004, GlobalGiving has mobilized over \$18 million in funding to more than 1,000 grassroots projects in over 90 countries. Each spring, GlobalGiving allows a select number of non-profits to apply and create a project page on their website. Over four weeks, these non-profits then race to raise money via the website, and once a non-profit raises a minimum of \$4,000 from 50 donors, it achieves a long-term spot on GlobalGiving. **We are thrilled that, as this newsletter goes to "print," KKOOM has qualified!!**

BUT . . . THAT'S NOT ALL. KKOOM is launching two volunteer-led projects this spring!:

• Emilee Lehenbauer will be purchasing \$500 worth of English education resources, art supplies, a white board, and helping to build a library at Chenam Orphanage in Seogwipo on Jeju Island, South Korea

 Kelly Kinne will be using up to \$500 to lead a book drive at Dunsan Girl's High School in Daejeon, South Korea. The collected books will be then donated to various orphanages through South Korea, including Chenam Orphanage in Jeju.

Long Term Planning: International Education Program

As part of our debut on GlobalGiving.org (see page 2), KKOOM has launched its fundraising and strategic planning for *a long-term international education program* for Korean orphans and children living in orphanages and group homes. This has been a long-term dream of KKOOM's founders and directors, and we wanted to take an opportunity to introduce this program to you.

Support the students after their return to the U.S. with With the help of KKOOM volunteers and continued opportunities for supporters, show students different aspects of learning English. U.S. life over two weeks including school visits, homestay experiences, volunteer opportunities, and sight-seeing.

The purpose of this program is to give South Korean orphans opportunities to further their study of English and in order to be successful in school and beyond. English language skills are very valued in South Korea and are required for gaining college admittance and getting hired for jobs, even entry level ones. The study tour would also expose Korean children to American culture and would promote international friendship. The Korean children would also help educate Americans about South Korean culture and about the current situation of orphans and poor children living in South Korea.

We estimate that it will take \$25,000 to launch this program on a small scale in the first year. In order to be able to offer the opportunity to new students year after year, we anticipate that the cost will be a minimum of \$6,000 per child annually. We will continue to rely on our allvolunteer supporters and laborers in order to make this program a reality and a success. We can't do it without you! We are presently organizing a volunteer task force to begin preparations, which we expect to unfold over the next two years.
