# COVID-19 Awareness




## DISTRIBUTING (THREE-WHEELER CARGO CARRIERS)

The Iraqi Children Hope is committed to providing sustainable solutions to the social problems stemming from poverty. Self-development is crucial to achieving this.

The workshop was set for the period from 12/17/2020 to 1/12/2021.

Each student received a certificate of completion and beauty supply products as gifts from ICHOPE.

The women are taught the basic of beauty industry, including how to do nails, massaging, facial, make up, waxing and hairdressing. We offer skills development programs to over 120 women.

Hope offered Mariam beauty school training, allowing her to work at a beauty salon near her home, where she uses her newly acquired skills of facial make-up application and hairdressing. Not only is Mariam now equipped with a skill set allowing her to earn an income, but she is also able to provide for her mother and two brothers, transforming their deprivation into happiness!

## TREATMENT OF A CHILD HEALTH CASE

Case # 54: Mustafa is a young child at the gentle and inquisitive age of 5. Sadly, he lost his father as a toddler. Unfortunately, Mustafa's tragedy does not end there. This young boy has suffered more emotional and physical pain than most people have, well into adulthood. After the death of his father, his mother was unable to provide food, clothing, and medical care. Mustafa suffered from a bulge in his abdomen, but his mother could not afford to have it diagnosed. Mustafa's bulge continued to grow, and as a young child concerned with the impression of his peers, he became embarrassed to play with other young children and isolated himself.





I.C. Hope became aware of the situation and quickly came to Mustafa's help by providing him the care of a specialized doctor who diagnosed him with an inguinal hernia, requiring emergency surgery. With the help of generous donors as yourselves, I.C. Hope was able to cover the expenses of Mustafa's medical care including his surgery, treatment, medication, and follow up care. Mustafa is now a happy and active young boy, eager to play with his peers. When asked how she now feels witnessing her son's restored health, Mustafa's mother responds with tears flowing down her cheeks, unable to express her gratitude for the donors responsible for giving her son a chance at a happy childhood, free from the pain he had once endured.


The I.C. Hope team became aware of Ali's situation and provided him with medical attention, where he was diagnosed with a lack of hearing, which fortunately is treatable with supplemental aid. I.C. Hope then purchased the necessary hearing aid required for Ali to be able to hear. Now that Ali can hear, I.C. Hope continued with Ali's care by providing him with special speech therapy and tutoring sessions to learn to speak, beginning with the very basics of learning the alphabet.

Imagine the feeling of a young and innocent boy, fallen victim to a society plagued by war and poverty, to be able to hear sound after 12 years of silence! Ali now has a chance for a bright future by enabling his sense of hearing, which allowed him to speak, read, write, and learn. Thankfully, Ali is progressing wonderfully and eagerly awaits his tutoring sessions, showing up for class even before his tutor arrives!


