LETTER OF INTRODUCTION

Allow us to introduce you to PHALABORWA NATURAL HERITAGE FOUNDATION - NPC.

PNHF – NPC is a registered Non-profit company, registration number 2020/872513/08. The company is based in Phalaborwa, in the province of Limpopo in South Africa. Phalaborwa is situated right next to the Kruger National Park and is surrounded by nature reserves and protected areas. PNHF – NPC focusses on conservation and assisting nature reserves and other conservation organizations in the removal of snares, anti-poaching, rescue of animals trapped in snares, rescue of injured animals, data collection, research, litter clean-ups, environmental education and community outreach mostly, but not limited to the Mopani region of the Limpopo province.

<u>PNHF – NPC was created in March of 2020 and since the company has organized or assisted in the following projects</u>: 13 Snare Sweeps during which 375 snares have been removed, 26 carcasses discovered of animals killed in snares, ranging from buffalo, waterbuck, plains zebra, impala, steenbok, warthog, black-backed jackal white-backed vulture and domestic animals. These sweeps have been conducted in the Greater Kruger National Park, state owned land, private reserves and public land.



All the snares removed are donated to Down to the Wire, an organization that turns the snares into jewellery and in turn use the profits generated to pay for the veterinary fees to treat animals with snares on them.



Darting and treating of the following animals that had snares on them: 3 spotted hyena, 1 lioness, 1 cape buffalo, 1 southern giraffe, 1 waterbuck, 1 warthog and 1 domestic cow.



The rescue of a hippopotamus trapped inside a cement sewerage catchment dam.



Assisted Elephants Alive in the tracking, locating and immobilizing of two elephant bulls to have their tracking collars replaced.



Litter clean-up operations in and around Phalaborwa.





Community outreach project to donate Hippo Rollers to poor communities living next to reserves we operate in, done in collaboration with Hippo Roller and Inscent K9 and other organizations.



Aerial game census and reconnaissance flights for anti-poaching operations on tribal reserves.
