MESSAGE FROM MONICA DAN, FOUNDER



## END OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR

Now that the current academic year is approaching the final stages, we will make further enhancements to the school infrastructure and environment. The three academic years squeezed in two calendar years created strain on the school staff, parents and students. As a consequence, we focused on the student's wellbeing and mental support. From January 2023 we will finally revert to the usual order.

## **PROGRESS ON BUILDING WORKS**

Kenya has been through the national election process which concluded just a few days ago. The main side effect of any electoral campaign is the slowing down of all the public and administrative activities, with an impact on the registration and planning process for Volunteers Foundation Academy. From the information we received from the field, we are confident our applications will now continue with finalisation of the required processes and we will soon be able to start the building activities. Our project partners Betts Townsend Taylor are diligently following up on the progress.

We are planning the next building activities to carry out. Obviously, we will have to balance the immediate requirements with the long-term redevelopment master plan to make sure everything we do now, while we raise the funds required, can be reused and will not affect the final building layout.

One of the priorities highlighted in a recent local authority's site survey, is to build some additional toilets to maintain the minimum students/facilities ratio. We are looking into this installation with our construction partners and planning the works in December, when school is closed for the end of year holiday.
