In their favour, it has been pointed out that private schools cover the entire curriculum and offered extra-curricular activities such as science fairs, general knowledge, sports, music and drama. There is some disagreement over which system has better educated teachers. Even the poorest often go to private schools despite the fact that government schools are free.
