The Life Home Project Foundation 

In the past The Life Home Project Foundation acted as a hospice for women with AIDS and gradually became a shelter as the disease became treatable. We offered Handicraft Workshops, Bakery Workshops and Sewing Workshops, which gave women vocational training through arts and crafts. Providing an opportunity for these people to develop their skills and feel useful again dramatically increased their self-esteem and confidence. As a result, the quality of life of many HIV-infected people improved; most of them have been able to return to their communities and to support themselves and their families. Furthermore, access to anti-retroviral medications has meant that HIV infected individuals can now lead much healthier lives in the long term.

Who We Are



Our Mission is to help the local Thai Community in Phuket who are HIV infected/affected live a healthier productive life.

Our Vision includes educating the local Thai Community in Phuket on the issue of HIV/AIDS and where those who are HIV infected or affected are taken care of with love and honored as valid individuals in the broader community.

We have been registered under Thai law from the time of our founding date in 2002 and have been continuously serving the HIV/AIDS community in Phuket.

The *current* focus of the Life Home Project Foundation has been helping HIV-infected children and AIDS-affected children. Our children's home, permitted by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security, fosters children from 1 to 18 years old. Our operations were awarded for the work over several consecutive years. We offer these children a warm shelter, provide a caring environment and higher quality of life than many would otherwise have in their homes with HIV-infected or AIDS affected family members.

The Life Home Project Foundation's educational scholarship program supports the children currently living in the project as well as those who have lived at the project and are now old enough to be living in the community.

In addition, our daycare service for children of HIV affected families allows HIV-infected parents to earn a living during the day while their children are being cared for. The young children are given nutritious meals, taught child development exercises and given a general education to prepare them for kindergarten.

The Life Home Project Foundation has adapted to the changing needs of HIV-affected individuals while never losing focus on our initial mission of HIV prevention. We must continue to support the children currently housed at the project, many of whom have been orphaned by HIV/AIDS, to ensure a positive future for them.
