

1. CHALLENGES

Security and looting: Caution is advised in the area of Gros Marin, in the North of Cavallion. There are reports of armed individuals who are blocking the roads (including one towards Barraderes) and pointing their guns at vehicles trying to pass.

On August 23, the distribution convoy for CORE en route to Maniche was taken by members of the population. A new strategy following Cash For Work is now being implemented to avoid this in the future.

2. ACTIVITIES

HEAVY EQUIPMENT:

- August 24: A high school in Camp-Perrin that served as a community fixture for thousands of students was completely destroyed. The debris team is clearing the buildings to allow for temporary structures to be set up and for classes to be held temporarily in tents.

Maniche:

- Debris removal in 1 school (completely destroyed) and 1 detached house:
 - 450 m³
- Demolition of 1 health center

Camp-Perrin / Marceline:

- Debris removal: 208 m³
- Demolition of the Mazenod school
- Deviation works in the river bed of La Ravine to create a temporary road

La Sucrierie / Berdumelle:

- Work to create access roads to Berdumelle over 1 km
- Demolition of a church at La Sucrierie

- Work to divert the bed of the Dejoie River for the passage of vehicles and trucks

HEALTH:

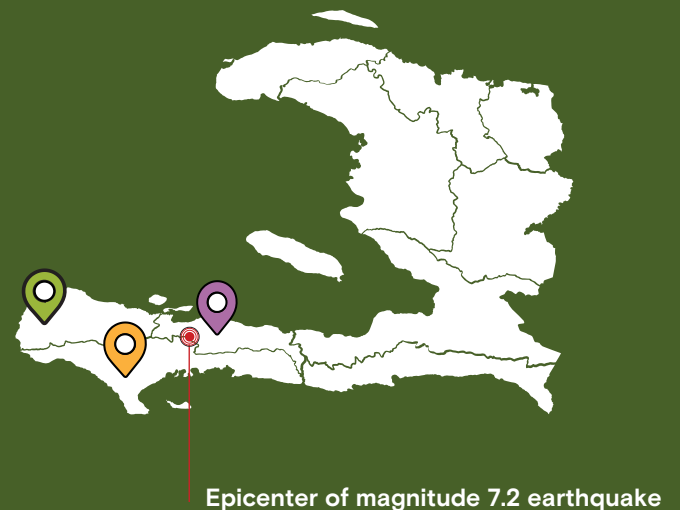
CORE's medical team set up in the Guillaume section of Camp-Perrin, close to the debris team. This is part of CORE's strategy to increase exposure and acceptance by the community. There was a line of about 200 patients.

On August 24, CORE worked at two sites:

- Guillaume section of Camp-Perrin:
 - Many more women than men
 - Many mothers are without milk
 - The medical team will now add in formula for infants as part of the medical list
- Gaetan section of Camp Perrin:
 - Site opened in the evening at the request of the local community leaders
 - Many dermatological issues resulting from the lack of sanitation options

Medical volunteers were at the HIC in Les Cayes:

- CORE continues operating 23 vaccination sites across Haiti
- Since the start of CORE's earthquake response on Aug 15, its medical team has treated a total of 1,186 patients, consisting of 618 women, 311 men, and 257 children. This includes two sections in the commune of Camp-Perrin:
 - Gaetan: 26 women, 13 men, and 12 children were treated
 - Guillaume: 100 women, 65 men, and 70 children were treated
- On August 23, emergency room space was increased two-fold

- On August 24, space for patient hold for people waiting for surgery was increased
 - This avoids plugging up ER beds
 - This cleared up a lot of treatment space and that allowed for more patients (mostly ortho patients)
 - Starting to see "wellness" issues, which indicates that the immediate urgency is coming to an end
- Ortho materials have been ordered and were scheduled to arrive on August 24 (crutches, plaster, etc.)
- Medical supplies have been inventoried in "Le Palmier" warehouse
- CORE has 4 community mobilizers as of August 24

PRIORITY COMMUNITIES IN SUD

- Camp-Perrin
- Maniche
- Cavaillon
- Saint-Louis-du-Sud
- Les Cayes

- CORE will begin mobilizing in Maniche and Saint-Louis-du-Sud for first few days with the goal of preparing the community for shelter distribution by the end of the week
- Shelter distribution and community mobilization is done in coordination with debris and health services
- Purchase milk/formula for infants
