ACCESSIBILITY TO VIRTUAL CLASSES BY PRIMARY SCHOOL

BACKGROUND

The suspension of face-to-face classes generated dropouts of primary and secondary school students, because many of them did not have the conditions required for virtual classes. For this reason, the Ministry of Education-MINEDU provided Tablet computers for primary school students from 4th to 6th grade, so that children in the first, second and third grades were not considered in this program. In addition, local families are engaged in agricultural activities for self-consumption, so they have limited economic resources for the purchase of technological equipment (cell phones, computers or tablets).

Given this need to provide students with the conditions required to participate in the virtual classes, we knocked on the doors of other sources, obtaining the resources to support primary level students in the aforementioned grades.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- 185 students from the first three grades of the primary level of eleven educational institutions, who were not considered in the delivery of tablets by the Ministry of Education, received from the microproject an 8-inch computer device (Tablet) and a kit of school supplies. Such equipment and materials were very useful for students to receive their virtual classes through the "I learn at home" platform and at the same time communicate more easily with teachers using social networks such as google meet, WhatsApp and/or video calls.
- In order for the children to have internet on their tablets, the parents purchased a pre-paid chip from the operator that has the best coverage in the project area, so that the students have internet and do not have difficulties in the development of their classes and the delivery of homework is done on the dates indicated.
